### Pancake Breakfast

In late February, Shari Tompe from The Hazelmere Pumpkin Patch came to the school and showed our students how to tap the maple trees over the school fence above the river. We collected a total of 9 litres of sap from three trees. The children sampled the raw sap ("It tastes like water with a little bit of sugar!") before I took it home to boil down. After 6 hours of boiling, the syrup became a delicious rich, golden brown: we were left with a scant 2 cups of syrup! The children will get two small pancakes in order to do a "syrup taste off" with a bit of the syrup from our trees and a bit of walnut syrup provided by Shari Tompe. Parents are welcome to join us. ## Ms. Stanger Pro-D



Last week I had the opportunity to travel to Port Hardy with three other Surrey School administrators to follow up our inquiry into how non-indigenous educators can bring the Aboriginal Perspectives and Knowledge in the curriculum and First Peoples Principles of Learning alive for all students. We visited Kwakkwaka'wakw carver Calvin Hunt in his studio and he spoke about how he uses traditional stories and artistic techniques to carve totem poles and paint bentwood boxes with a modern style. We met two Kwakkwaka'wakw weavers in the town of Fort Rupert who are interested in sharing their knowledge of weaving cedar bark with our students.

We visited the Gwa'sala-'Nakwaxda'xw School on the Tsulquate Reserve near Port Hardy. The kindergarten to grade 7 student population is made up of children from the Gwa'sala-'Nakwaxda'xw nation. The teachers are mostly non-indigenous, but, along with elders from the nation and indigenous teacher assistants, they are able to embed the traditional stories, knowledge and language within their teaching of the BC curriculum. It was so uplifting to see these children learning in a hopeful and honouring environment. I was lucky enough to join the kindergarten class as they headed to learn outdoors. We took a 5-minute walk to their forest classroom beside a waterfall and a small stream. The teacher did so many things the same way we do at our school: the same way of teaching the alphabet (but interspersed with both Kwakwala and English words), the same play-based, place-based learning outdoors, and following children's curiosity with books and magnifiers and the local plants and animals. I was so inspired to take part in such rich learning! It is my hope to carry on some of these traditions and knowledge of story and the environment from the first nations of the northwest coast in our school as well.

I will be heading out of town again(!) on May 2-6. I will be going to New York to the Learning and the Brain Conference. This is my second time attending one of these amazing conferences. The last time I went I learned about the benefits of teaching a growth mindset and it changed the way I think of learning. This time the focus will be Social Emotional Learning. I know I will come back and inspire the staff with my new-found knowledge!
