## Community Engagement & Naming New Schools

Hi everyone, as you know we have three new schools that have been announced in the communities around your sites – all of which will begin construction in the coming school year!

Our district's school naming committee (which includes Jordan, trustee Shawn Wilson and trustee Bob Holmes) has put forth five potential names for the three sites and we are now engaging our communities to gather feedback on these names and get ideas for other options. Our goal is to name these three sites and to develop a list of approved names that can be used for other potential sites that are still awaiting approval.

Please find attached a <u>fact sheet</u> that outlines this process. We will be running an online campaign over the next 2 weeks with boosted posts on social media. There will be also an article published on our home page on Monday (that links to the fact sheet). We are hoping each of you can help with our community engagement efforts by:

#### Sharing the fact sheet with your school communities and staff.

Feel free to also use the article we publish on our home page on Monday in your parent newsletters, and share district social content on your school social media channels. We will be including this information in next week's weekly memo as well.

#### Engage your classrooms to generate potential names.

The hope is that students research their communities and identify potential names (along with a rationale on why the name was chosen - the fact sheet includes 5 names and rationale as an example). And there is incentive! If the name identified by the class is chosen for one of the 3 sites, we will award that class with \$500 to be used for classroom resources. If a class selects a name that makes it on our list of approved names for futures sites, that class will be awarded \$100 to be used for classroom resources.

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#### School Fees 2021-2022

Each school year, parents support their child(ren)'s formal learning experiences in a wide variety of ways. We so appreciate all that you do to ensure a successful year!

We will be providing an itemized school supply list based on grade for the next school year. Parents may opt to purchase supplies directly from the company. However, parents may choose to wait to do the purchasing themselves. School supply fees for 2021-2022 may change due to circumstances in schools because of Covid-19.

In addition to school supplies, parents are periodically asked for monies to cover specific items and/or special events. No student will be denied the opportunity to participate in any school activity due to the inability to pay. Please contact the Principal should you require any financial assistance.

As we plan for the 2021/2022 school year, we anticipate the following costs:

**Student Planner:** We encourage all students in Grades 1-7 to purchase a School Planner at a cost of \$5. Included in the planner is our school code of conduct, school calendar and school district information. We find this to be an excellent tool for facilitating home/school communication, as well as for developing our students' organizational skills. However, using our school planner is optional as a parent may purchase his/her own version.

**Field Studies and Field Trips:** Classes often enjoy educational visits to community facilities which extend and enhance the curriculum. While we use school monies or fundraise to cover the costs of such activities wherever possible, there are times when parents are asked to contribute towards the cost of the trip. If you choose to have your child not participate in a field study, a suitable program will be provided at the school.

**Musical Instruments:** Grade 4 students may learn to play the recorder. Students will have the option of purchasing one through our music teacher for approximately \$10 or receiving one on loan from the school. Also, our Grade 7 students will have band classes and need to either purchase or rent an instrument. Costs vary depending on the instrument.

#### **Kindergarten Supplies**

Kindergarten teachers bulk order supplies for all Kindergarten children. Parents will be asked to contribute which will not exceed \$45 – exact cost to be determined by the school.
