 - i. Learning Support Services at École Salish is called Inclusion.

 - iv. The Inclusion department also supports Aboriginal, Gifted and students with any learning needs.

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8. Opening Day/Week

When school opens on September 4th, it will be a new experience for students and teachers coming to École Salish. Being a new building, everyone will need assistance getting around the first day. For that reason, we are having each grade come into the building separately starting with the Grade 8s.

All students will be at school for 1 hour and then dismissed to go home.

10. Traffic Flow/ Safety

The Surrey School District worked closely with ICBC and the City of Surrey to develop a safety plan for traffic flow to and from École Salish. Starting September 4, there will be changes to the traffic pattern on 184th and Fraser Highway. Improvements include:

- New pedestrian crossing
- New light pattern at Fraser Hwy
- New Traffic lights along 184th
- New cross walks on Fraser Hwy (at approximately 180th St.)
- Longer pedestrian light at Fraser Hwy

The parking lot at École Salish will flow in <u>one</u> direction only.

Extra School District staff will be present in September to help enforce the new traffic pattern

- One way drop off and pick up from the school parking lot
- A new traffic light at the entrance of the school will allow cars to exit the school turning right or left
- Entry to drop off students will be off the lane beside the school parking lot.
- Cars will not be able to enter the parking lot from the traffic light in front of the school

We recommend that right from September 4th, students use the mode of transportation they intend to use throughout the year. For example, if students intend to use Translink, it is important that the need for transit service starts right in September.
