Principal's Message



Hi Everyone!

The staff at Ecole Kwantlen Park are very excited to welcome our students back in September. With the announcement from the **Minister of Education**, we now have a better idea of what school will look like. We want our students and families to know that the administration has been hard at work planning for the reopening of Kwantlen Park. We are also making every effort to ensure that the health, safety and well-being of our students and staff remains our top priority and is at the heart of our planning.

We want to ensure that students, staff and families remain informed throughout the 2020-2021 school year. We will be providing regular updates via our website, school communities, and social media channels.

The following is an overview of our plans and important information with you to help you make informed decisions regarding your plans for the upcoming school year.

In July, the Ministry of Education provided direction to school boards for the reopening of schools this September 2020.

The Ministry of Education Has Decided: The September start-up will begin delayed a few days and we will start in stage 2 (see diagram below). Stage 2 is supported by the four foundational principles established at the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic:

- Maintain a healthy and safe environment for all students, families, teachers and staff
- Provide the services needed to support the children of our essential workers (ESWs)
- Support vulnerable students who may need special assistance
- Provide continuity of educational opportunity for all students

First Day: As a result of the government's decision to open our school with a delayed start, we are currently pleased to welcome our students back on the "changed" first day of school. At the time of writing this newsletter, we are still getting guidelines on what the opening day will look like. More information will come in the weeks before school is open. Please stay connected to our social media site and web page. We know that parents have many questions about the upcoming school year and schools and classrooms will look different when we return.

We will have prescribed health and safety measures in conjunction with the Ministry of Education and Public Health requirements. Appropriate signage will be posted throughout our school sites, plexi-glass will be installed in appropriate office spaces, hand sanitizer will be available in classrooms and offices, and our classrooms will be thoroughly and frequently cleaned.

As students return to school, our teachers are ready to welcome them back with warmth, calm, care and delight. We are delighted to see our students again! We know that the COVID-19 pandemic has been a challenging experience for many students and families and we will be focusing on building nurturing relationships and supporting their well-being.

Kwantlen's Plan: Currently we are developing a model for secondary students. Students who choose to attend in person and will be placed in a "Cohort Model." Students will primarily be operating in a model well below the 120 student maximum cohort allowance outlined by the ministry. In September, we will experience a quarter system format, which involves a four-semester school year, with each semester offering two course each. Each quarter is approximately 9.5 to 10 weeks and ensures students are still engaging in the required hours of learning. We will have

more specific details in the weeks to come as we refine our plan. Unfortunately, in order to meet the required health and safety requirements, this system may require some students to change their course selection or have some courses on-line. Our specific model will be ready the week before school and shared with all families as soon as we can.

Secondly, we are ready to be flexible if there is an increase in COVID-19 cases and the school year is interrupted. We are prepared to adapt accordingly to any requirement.

Keeping Our School Safe: Staff and students are asked to self monitor for symptoms of COVID-19 and stay home if they are feeling unwell. Anyone who tests positive may not return to school until they are cleared according to public health guidance. Schools must ensure attendance records (reason for the cohorts), be maintained and readily available in case they are needed to be given to public health for contact tracing purposes.

Not Returning to Kwantlen Park for Instruction: Students who will not be returning to school in person will have an option to participate in *Distance Learning*. In-person learning may not be possible for everyone. If, for a personal or health reason, you do not want your child to attend "in person," and need to have direct on-line learning, please contact your Vice-Principal as soon as possible. We will ask that families be patient as we develop your child's transition plan from one form of learning to another.

As with every year, Kwantlen Park has had some staffing changes. We would like to welcome Mr. Gepp (Spanish), Ms. Kyle (Dance), Mr. Fang (Math), Ms. Duffield (Careers) and Ms. Missellbrook (Counselling) to Kwantlen Park. We have also said farewell to a number of teachers who have been at Kwantlen Park for some time. Our very best wishes go to Mr. Sparkman, Ms. Quintanilla, Ms. Allard, and Ms. Wardle. I am also grateful to the teachers who were only with us a short time. These teachers have done wonderful things for our school and we wish them well in their new assignments and retirement.

Please note that this is the only newsletter we will be mailing to you. Future newsletters will be posted to the school website (www.surreyschools.ca/kwantlenpark) on the last Friday of September, November, January, February, April, May and June. A limited number of printed copies will be available at the office.

On behalf of all the staff, I would like to welcome everyone back. Please stay connected to social media and the news for potential changes to the start of the school year. Enjoy the rest of your summer and we will see our students soon.

Kwantlen Park Secondary General Fees 2020-2021

Parents and students are advised of the following general fees and workbook pricing for the 2020-2021 school year. The school will provide the essential materials and resources necessary for students to meet the learning outcomes for each course. Students will need to continue to provide their own basic supplies and equipment for their own personal use such as paper, writing tools, calculators, notebooks, gym attire and musical instruments. Workbooks may be provided to students on loan or they may be purchased outright.

Some courses such as textiles and woodwork provide students with the option of using different or better quality materials which they may bring from home or purchase from the school at cost. Some courses offer optional certifications or external examinations for which there are charges. If you wish to discuss the implications that these charges may have on your son or daughter, please contact your child's Vice Principal @ 604-588-6934.

Student, Grad Fees and Yearbook can be paid on-line towards the end of August – we will post the date that this is available on the web page. Please note that Student and Grad fees are to be paid by the end of September. Attendance & Signing Out

Attendance: Regular attendance is essential for academic success. If students are ill and not attending school for the day we ask that parents/guardians phone the school at 604-588-6934, **before** 8:30 am to notify the office. Please have your child's student # available when reporting an absence. If this is not possible, students should bring a note explaining their absence when they return to school. These notes should be dated and turned in at the office. Parents can also phone the office to request homework for pick up for students who are ill.



Hats and Inappropriate Clothing

Students must dress in a manner that is appropriate for a public school. Writing, pictures, logos and content on clothing items must be appropriate for a public school, and must not include drug, alcohol, violence or gang representation. Midribs need to be covered, undergarments should not be shown, and students should be properly covered up. Footwear is essential for hygiene and safety.

The school may request that students cover up with more appropriate clothing, or go home to change, if the attire is not appropriate.

Kwantlen Park Secondary School is a **HATS & HOODS OFF** school. This includes baseball caps, toques, headbands, visors and bandanas. This is solely for **safety reasons** as it allows school staff to more effectively identify people who shouldn't be in our school.

Cell Phones

We are asking for the support of parents/guardians and students in making the learning environment at *Kwantlen Park Secondary* cell phone free during class time. Personal cell phone use in class poses a distraction to not only the user but to others in the class. Teachers will contact parents/guardians if cell phone use during class time becomes an issue with their son/daughter. If cell phone use during class time continues to disrupt the learning environment, parents/guardians may be asked to pick up their son's/daughter's cell phone from the school. Thank you for respecting, and helping to maintain, a positive learning environment for all students and teachers in the classroom.



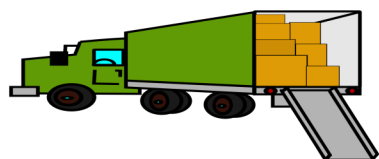

BACK TO SCHOOL

KWANTLEN PARK SECONDARY SCHOOL CODE OF CONDUCT 2020-2021

Safe and Caring School Environments:

Do Not Tolerate the Presence Of:

- Intoxicating or banned substances
- Weapons or replica weapons and explosives
- Intruders or trespassers (All visitors to the school must first report to the office)

Or Misuse Of:

- *Cyberspace/Cell Phones/Electronic Devices/Computers*—students are to be aware that they may be subject to discipline (or, if applicable, confiscation of personal property) for misuse of technology if it negatively impacts on the school environment.

Forms of unacceptable conduct cited above are only some examples and are not an all-inclusive list.

Consequences

Consequences will be applied to unacceptable conduct in accordance with *Surrey School District Safe & Caring Schools Reg. 9410.2 Disciplinary Guide* found in the student agenda. Progressive discipline methods based on the severity and the frequency of the behaviour and age of the student, will be implemented to alter the inappropriate and/or unsafe behaviour.

Notification

As circumstances warrant, administrators have a responsibility to advise other parties following an incident:

- Parents/guardians of the student offender (s)
- Parents/guardians of the student victim (s)
- *Surrey School Board* officials will be contacted as required by *School District Policy, (i.e. Level 1, 11 and 111 suspensions)*
- Police and other agencies as required by law
- School staff and school community as deemed appropriate by the school administration and/or District administration

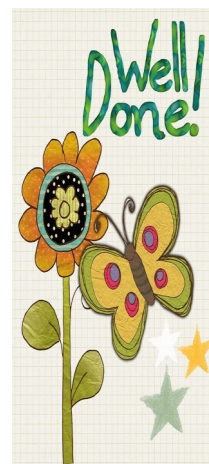
