School District #36 (Surrey) - School Code of Conduct 2021-2022

Guildford Park Secondary School's Code of Conduct is designed to provide guidelines for appropriate student behaviour while under the jurisdiction of the school, while at any school-sponsored function or where engaging in the activity will have impact on a Safe, Caring and Orderly School environment.

Students have a responsibility to respect the rights and dignity of others and to become actively involved in their own academic learning and social growth.

Conduct Expectations

Acceptable conduct is demonstrated by:

- respecting oneself, others and the school's facility and grounds
- engaging in responsible behaviour in all learning and school activities (*attend classes regularly, be seated in your seat by the second bell, be prepared for class, complete all assignments, and use good manners and good common sense*)
- modeling respectful and responsible behaviour to their peers and younger students, in the community and while acting as school ambassadors
- conducting oneself in a manner which in no way compromises the safety or well being of others

Safe & Caring School Environments:

Are Free From Acts Of

- bullying, cyber-bullying, harassment, threat, intimidation
- violence in any form
- abuse in any form
- discrimination in any form
- theft
- vandalism
- retribution against a person who has reported incidents

Do Not Tolerate the Presence Of

- intoxicating or banned substances
- weapons or replica weapons and explosives
- intruders or trespassers (All visitors to the school must first report to the office)

Or Misuse Of

- *Cyberspace/Cell Phones/Electronic Devices/Computers* - students are to be aware that they may be subject to discipline (or, if applicable, confiscation of personal property) for misuse of technology if it negatively impacts on the school environment

Forms of unacceptable conduct cited above are only some examples and not an all-inclusive list.

Consequences

Consequences will be applied to unacceptable conduct in accordance with Surrey School District Safe & Caring Schools Reg. 9410.2 Disciplinary Guide. Progressive discipline methods based on the severity and the frequency of the behaviour and age of the student, will be implemented to alter the inappropriate and/or unsafe behaviour.

Notification

As circumstances warrant, administrators have a responsibility to advise other parties following an incident:

- parents/guardians of the student offender(s)
- parents/guardians of the student victim(s)
- Surrey School Board officials will be contacted as required by School District Policy, (i.e. Level I, II and III suspensions)
- police and other agencies as required by law
- school staff and school community as deemed appropriate by the school administration and/or District administration

GUILDFORD PARK CODE OF CONDUCT

GENERAL STATEMENT

Our common purpose at Guildford Park is to acquire knowledge, develop skills, develop positive attitudes toward learning, be responsible citizens and respect the rights and property of others.

To this end, students are expected to demonstrate the attributes of a responsible young adult by adhering to the following expectations while under the jurisdiction of the school, travelling to and from school, at school, or while at any school sponsored function whenever and wherever held.

Violations of the Guildford Park Code of Conduct will be addressed by pre-planned, fair, progressive discipline which is intended to be preventative and restorative and which takes into account individuality, maturity and development. These may include some or all of the following:

- Teacher/student conferences
- Parental contact by teachers
- Classroom consequences
- Detentions
- Referral to counsellor

- Mediation
- Restorative Justice
- Referral to Vice-Principal
- Removal of school privileges
- Suspension

Threat Assessment Protocol – Fair Notice

What behaviours initiate a student threat assessment?

A student threat assessment will be initiated when behaviours include, but are not limited to, serious violence or violence with intent to harm or kill, verbal/written threats to harm/kill others, social media threats to harm/kill others, possession of weapons (including replicas), bomb threats and fire setting.

Duty to report

To keep school communities safe and caring, staff, parents, students and community members must report all threat-related behaviours.

What is a threat?

A threat is an expression of intent to do harm or act out violently against someone or something. Threats may be verbal, written, drawn, posted on social media or made by gesture. Threats must be taken seriously, investigated and responded to.

What is a Threat Assessment Team?

Each school has a Threat Assessment Team which is multi-disciplinary. The team may include principal, vice-principal, district resource counsellor, school counsellor and police.

What is the purpose of a student threat assessment?

The purposes of a student threat assessment are:

- ◆ To ensure the safety of students, staff, parents and others.
- ◆ To ensure a full understanding of the context of the threat.
- ◆ To understand factors contributing to the threat makers' behaviour.
- ◆ To be proactive in developing an intervention plan that addresses the emotional and physical safety of the threat maker.
- ◆ To promote the emotional and physical safety of all.



What happens in a student threat assessment?

All threat making behaviour by a student shall be reported to the principal who will activate the protocol for the initial response. Once the team has been activated, interviews may be held with the student(s), the threat maker, parents and staff to determine the level of risk and develop an appropriate response to the incident. Intervention plans will be developed and shared with parents, staff and students as required.

Can I refuse to participate in a threat assessment process?

It is important for all parties to engage in the process. However, if for some reason there is a reluctance to participate in the process by the threat maker or parent / guardian, the threat assessment process will continue in order to promote a safe and caring learning environment.

Student Accident Insurance

Did you know . . .

The Surrey School District does not insure expenses for student injuries that happen on school grounds or during school activities?

You are responsible for these expenses as a parent or guardian.

It's recommended that parents consider an insurance provider for school injuries. Several companies offer accident insurance and you can choose a plan that suits your family's individual needs the best.

The Surrey School District and your District Parent Advisory Council provide a choice for families to voluntarily purchase private accident insurance through the "insure my kids" accident program, underwritten by Old Republic Insurance Company of Canada.

Insure my kids accident insurance offers protection against the potentially high costs of serious injury from unexpected accidents and is especially valuable for families who:

- do not have medical or dental plans,
- have limited plans, as it may help supplement health and dental benefits, or
- have active children who enjoy sports and outdoor activities.

Accidents can, and do, happen

Insure my kids accident insurance has a selection of plans to suit most budgets. Benefits include coverage for:

- A full year (September to September), 24 hours a day, whether at school or at home;
- Expenses such as ambulance, physiotherapy, private tutoring, counselling, and much more that are limited or not covered by private or group insurance plans, or provincial health plans;
- Injury-related dental treatment;
- Out-of-province or country emergency medical expenses.

If you change your address during the school year, your insure my **kids** accident insurance plan is transferable from school to school, anywhere in Canada.

Insurance premiums range from \$17.00 to \$33.00 per year, depending on the plan selected, and your child is covered all the time, not just while at school. A discounted premium is available for families with three or more children.

The insurance agreement will be between you and Old Republic Canada and insure my kids and becomes effective on the date the enrolment application and payment are received by the insurance carrier.
