#### Student Schedules 2024 - 2025:

Student schedules will be visible in MyEd on August 21, 2024 @ 3:00pm.

A Microsoft form will be available for course change requests for Grades 10-12 students, from August 21 - September 6 (no change requests permitted for Grades 8&9). Students can request a course change if they are missing a block, missing a required course for graduation, or missing a prerequisite for their University program. This form will be the only way that a student can make a course change. Course change requests sent through counsellor emails and TEAMS will be deleted. Students will need to be in the country in order to make a course change and will need to be at school on the first day of class, September 3rd. It is not possible to access this Microsoft form if you are out of the country.

## **Attendance Process**

If a student is going to be absent, late, needs an early dismissal, please contact the office at the school. Call 604-536-2131, or email semiahmoo@surreyschools.ca, or use the report an absence in "quicklink" on the school website, or use the Thunder-bird Times App. Please ensure you provide the student's <u>full name, grade and/or student number</u>, when reporting the absence. Please note we will not adjust "unreported" absences past seven days. Also, if a student will be missing <u>5 or more school days in a row</u>, please complete an extended absence form (a student can pick up at the office or download on the website, under Parent Resources).

#### Student Parking Lot and Passes

Students <u>must</u> register any vehicle they will be driving to school and get a parking pass to be displayed on the rearview mirror. The student driver information form can be obtained from the main office and will have to be signed by a parent/guardian, we will also ask for the make and model of the vehicle and the license plate number (we will copy the student's drivers licence). Please note there is a \$5.00 fee for the parking pass.

Please make sure cars are parked in the student designated area of the parking lot; this area is the last two rows closest to the volleyball courts (if students park in the staff parking, they will be asked to move their vehicle, any vehicles parked in a prohibited area may be subject to towing). \*please refer to the map on the last page

# Code of Conduct: Personal Digital Devices

Personal Digital Devices are defined as any personal electronic device that can be used to communicate or to access the internet, such as a cell phone, tablet, laptop, or smartwatch. These devices are important tools which can be used to enhance learning and prepare children for the world in which they will work and live. Personal digital devices provide support for children who rely on these tools to access learning through services such as translation, adaptations for Individual Education Plans, medical support, health needs, or to provide equity of access to resources. The classroom teacher is responsible for the learning environment in the classroom, for guiding children to use personal digital devices appropriately, and for determining when personal digital devices should be used.

The safe and responsible use of personal digital devices is expected by all Surrey School District students, employees, volunteers, parents, guardians, and community members who are on school district property or interacting with students or staff. This includes the following:

- Those using personal digital devices need to abide by the school code of conduct as well as all Provincial and Federal laws and the British Columbia Human Rights Code. This includes not using personal digital devices to engage or participate in bullying or harassment, discrimination, or defamation of character.
- At both elementary and secondary schools, personal digital devices can be used during class time to enhance learning at the direction of the classroom teacher. These devices should be used in a way that is respectful of other's learning and does not distract others in terms of light, sound, or by other means.
- At elementary schools, it is expected that personal digital devices are
  to be put away during non-class time such as recess and lunch.

  Exceptions to this are for students who need digital devices for
  medical or health reasons, translation, accessibility, or other studentspecific reasons.
- Personal Digital Devices should not be used during lock down procedures or drills. The use of personal digital devices during this time may impact the emergency safety response.
- Surrey School District staff and students should not be recorded, visually or audibly, for any reason without their prior consent.
- The Surrey School District is not responsible for lost, missing, or damaged personal digital devices that students choose to bring to school.


