### Flip flop challenge players! Players must bring their own flip-flop labelled with their name

#### **Throwing Competition**

Rules/terms and conditions

- 1. Flip-flop throwing is an ancient and noble sport and is conducted as a civilised affair. Fair play, good humour, and good manners must be shown at all times.
- 2. The Principals decision and interpretation of the rules is final.
- 3. The flip-flop must be the same size as the competitor's foot and must not be modified (wear and tear is acceptable). The only acceptable method of propulsion is the competitor's own arm, which must remain attached to them at all times.

Competitors must bring their own and labeled flip flop to compete on the day.

- 4. A throw will only count if it falls within the designated area (an arc of 35 degrees from the forward-most centre point of the pitch). Thongs that fall outside this area will be a "foul toss" and will not count.
- 5. Only one throw is allowed unless it results in a foul, in which case one additional throw is allowed.
- 6. Only the flip-flop throwers is permitted on the pitch unless the thrower requires help due to age or ability.
  - \* This game is played and measured like shotput, best out of 3 throws win\*
