Students in Grades 4-7 will have an opportunity to get involved in our community through our student leadership opportunities that centre on building student voice through service to both our school and neighborhood community. More information and applications will be coming out during the first few weeks of school for interested students.

A reminder to parents, we welcome open communication and encourage you to contact us with any questions, concerns, or feedback or to arrange an in-person meeting if necessary. We look forward to meeting with our families in the weeks to come.

STUDENT DROP OFF

Our parking lot is a staff parking lot and based upon the size of the school, we need all those parking spaces. The entrance/exit is only one vehicle wide as well. Do **NOT** pull into the parking lot, please. Children must be able to enter and exit the vehicle independently in our drop-off zone. The drop zone can become backed up so it is critical that we need to keep it moving freely. Children should exit their vehicle and walk along the sidewalk, and onto our grounds. Drivers please “crawl at a snail’s pace” through our drop off lane at all times to ensure student safety and to prevent accidents. We are strongly encouraging families to prioritize walking to school this year. If you must drive, and stay with your child (eg. Kindergarten parents) please park in the neighborhood, and walk in rather than get caught in the traffic congestion that will be near the school. Your attention to this will be appreciated. Follow all laws or you may be ticketed.

WHAT DOES OUR FIRST DAY LOOK LIKE?

Students in Grades 1-7 attend on **Tuesday, Sept 3 from 10:00am-11:00am**. Normal school hours will commence Wednesday, September 6. There is a map posted on the school website. Any students NEW to Betty Huff are asked to check-in at the office if they are not registered. If they are registered, they may line-up with their grade group in accordance with the posted map.

Our **Grade 1-7 students** will be sorted by grade group and alphabetical groupings during the first week. This sorting will be for attendance purposes and to prevent confusion for drop-off and pick-up during our first week back. Students will continue to line up and be dismissed from the same place until classes are finalized (likely Friday afternoon/Monday morning). Once student attendance is completed each day, students will be rotating within their grade group as we work on class organizations and build the best possible learning groups.

Students in Kindergarten attend on Tuesday Sept 3 at 10:00am until 11:00am like everyone else. K teachers may release K’s and parents prior to 11:00am. Kindergartens will receive their group letter on the first day and will follow the “Kindergarten Gradual Entry” schedule posted on our school website: <http://www.surreyschools.ca/bettyhuff>

Kindergarten parents will be asked to be with their child at the red playground where teachers will handle attendance and basic beginning information. Our focus on Tuesday will be getting our Ks into the new routine of entering the classroom, washing hands, becoming comfortable with a new learning space while developing friendships. We will have opportunities for parents to connect with staff. We will offer in-person meetings to visit or connect with teachers. **Visitors (including parents) are never allowed to freely wander/loiter/observe on the school grounds during the school day.**

WHAT DO CLASSES LOOK LIKE IN THE FIRST WEEK?

For the first few days of school, students will be working with a variety of teachers. The organization of our classes depends on the enrolment and the needs of all students. For us to make the best possible decisions for all our students, we need some time to find out which students are returning to Betty Huff and to balance these numbers with our new registrations. The office staff has been busy with new registrations this past week. Students will be placed in their classes when we have our final numbers and class organization approved. We want to have all students in their classes as soon as possible too. We appreciate your patience as we work to make balanced classes. As we set classes each year, we find that due to the way our enrolment numbers fall into place, we must create some combined classes. Parents often have questions or concerns regarding their child being in a combined class.

Please read the information sheet on the back of this newsletter that highlights some important details regarding combined classes. You may also wish to check out a thoughtful blog post written by Chris Wejr on combined classes (<http://chriswejr.com/2012/09/09/will-my-child-be-ok-in-a-split-class/>). Once classes have been finalized, parents will receive an email confirming class placement details. We ask that you support your child and allow time for them to adjust to their final placement. Please do not call the school requesting a change in classes as **no classroom changes will be made during this transition time**. We want to allow students time to adjust and connect with their assigned class. Students will find their friend(s) on the school grounds at recess and lunch every day.




ILLNESS PROTOCOLS

Thank you to all our families for your support over the last few years. Please continue to follow the rule that if your child is experiencing any symptoms of illness, that you keep them at home. As employees, this is the same message we have been given as we are sure the Health and Safety departments of your respective employments have told you.

K-12 Daily Health Check

Just a reminder that every parent is responsible for monitoring the daily health of your child(ren) before sending them to school. If your child does not meet the daily health check, you are required to keep them home. The Ministry of Health has also provided families with an additional resource, the “online K-12 Health Check”.

Public Schools are NOT public spaces. For security, we never have, nor will we ever have individuals freely wandering the hallways. If you require a meeting, please schedule an appointment with either the teacher and/or the principal. If you are volunteering, thank you, welcome, and please check-in at the office!

-  Perform a health check prior to entering the building
-  Visitors are to only access areas required for the visit
-  Ensure you have signed in at the office (and sign out when you leave).
