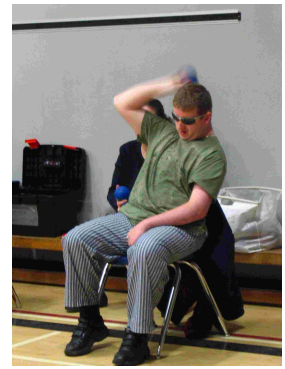

Descriptors for Boccia

Student athlete must meet the descriptors to be eligible

Sport Organization	SportAbility	Instructor: Debbie Kabush
Disability	Student athletes with physical disabilities only & very minor intellectual disability	SportAbility is mandated to work with persons with cerebral palsy, head injury, and/or stroke ; however, students with other disabilities who meet the eligibility requirements can attend
Eligibility	Photos provide a good sense of what is required from student athletes: <i>comprehension, social skills, desire to learn & can follow instructions</i>	Student athlete may or may not use a wheelchair but is willing to play from a seated position
