- Applying for a partnership program is a detailed process and is time sensitive with specific deadlines.

Summer district partnership programs that students attend in July & August after having completed grade 11:

- •Intro to Health Sciences (KPU)
- •Practice for Child and Youth Care Counsellors (Douglas College)
- •Intro to Legal Office Procedures (KPU)

These are individual district partnership courses. Upon completion, students receive 3 post-secondary university-college credits <u>and</u> 4 high school credits.

We also provide <u>Co-op Program opportunities</u>. These are a one-semester program in which students go out of the school for 2 full-time work experiences, as well as completing several academic or elective courses specific to each co-op, and receive the core attention and support of 1-2 teachers all semester. Co-op Programs allow students to:

- > explore career options, interests and abilities by participating in work experience placements
- > ensure that students do not miss instructional time from other courses while attending work experience
- > decide if a chosen career does or does not meet their expectations, prior to investing time and money at the post-secondary level
- develop and enhance employability skills
- > complete 30 hours of work/volunteer for use with their Capstone presentation
- > enable students to network with and obtain valuable references and contacts in a field of their choice.

For the 2021-2022 school year L.A. Matheson has <u>3 Co-op options</u> during course selection:

- Culinary Arts 12 Co-op
- ► Information Technology 11/12 Co-op
- the Matheson Co-op (Composition 11, Spoken Language 11, a Social Science 12, Work Experience 12)

Career Life Education 10 and Career Life Connections 12

These are personalized course that addresses each student's transition beyond high school through step-by-step support, field experiences, networking with specialists in the field, and through guest speakers and workshops. Work in these courses includes:

- Developing awareness about personal skills & strengths
- Career Exploration & building options for post-secondary (school, work, or traveling)
- Building community supports & mentorship opportunities
- Post-secondary program research and campus visits to KPU, SFU, UBC, or BCIT
- Assistance with post-secondary scholarship & financial aid applications
- Market exploration and networking for future career prospects and current job hunt
- Finances: saving, budgeting, taxes, loan applications, how to pay for living away from home and more
