1. Assessment

Communicating Student Learning

This year teachers will be using a variety of tools to communicate student learning. As you know, Freshgrade was phased out. Some teachers will be using the SPACES platform to communicate student learning. Spaces is also an online portfolio.

Other staff will be using a Template to communicate student learning.

Interim Reports

Interm Reports are a snapshot of your child's progress so far this school year. Next week, your child will be bringing home an interim report. It is intended to give caregivers,

teachers and students an opportunity to share student learning and set goals for the remainder of the year. Communications of Learning are meant to inform and advance learning by communicating what students are able to do, any areas requiring attention or improvement, and sharing ways to support learning.

Students are being taught how to have conversations about their learning and self-assess their own growth. By doing so, students can then respond to important questions about their learning. This includes questions like:

- What am I learning?
- Why is it important?
- What is the criteria for success?
- What am I doing well, and how do I know?
- What are my next steps for growth?

We encourage caregivers to have conversations with their child about their learning and use the questions listed to guide the conversation.

2. Running Club

Running Club will be meeting every Tuesday and Thursday for 3 weeks after school on the grass field. Children in Grades 3-7 are welcomed to participate! Notices were sent home yesterday. Please return notices to the classroom teacher or the office.

Our final celebration run will be on Thursday, October 25th. Hoping that families are able to come out and cheer the team on. Parents are welcome to join us on this day. Children are asked to wear running shoes, bring a water bottle and be ready to get physical!

3. Grade 7 Leadership

Students in Grade 7 have the opportunity to part of our Grade 7 leadership program. We will be meeting on most Wednesdays organizing and supporting school activities and events.

Students were asked to write an Expression of Interest to explain the reason(s) why they wish to join leadership. This is due on Wednesday, October 12th before our first meeting.

4. Volleyball

Volleyball season is now beginning in Surrey schools. All students in Grades 6 and 7 are welcome to join the team and attend practices and games. Volleyball practices will begin on Wednesday, October 12.

6. Library News

We are very excited to be hosting a Scholastic Book Fair in our library for the first time since 2019! The Book Fair is an opportunity for students and families to purchase books. All the proceeds from the Book Fair go towards new books and resources for our Fraser Wood Library, so it is a great fundraiser that benefits all our students. Our Book Fair will be open from October 24th to 28th. There will be time for each class to come to the book fair for browsing or shopping, and it will also be open before school, at lunchtime and after school. On Wednesday, October 26th, the Book Fair will be open until 5:00 for families that would like to visit the book fair with their children.

7. Affordability Fund- Financial support to make school more affordable for families that need it most.

In late August, the provincial government announced \$60 million in one-time funding to school districts in B.C. – including \$7.385 million to Surrey Schools – to make school more affordable for students and families.

Our district has now received this funding and has allocated amounts to all of our schools. Moving forward, these funds will be used to support families struggling with the rising cost of living due to inflation. We can use these funds at our school to ensure students can continue to participate fully in school, despite challenging financial situations. These funds can be used to help with school supplies, food and clothing costs, and additional fees so that students in need can take part in activities, such as field trips.

Families are encouraged to reach out to the office- Ms. Kaur, Ms. de Groot, teachers, or any other staff if any financial support is needed for school-based supplies or activities.

All information shared will be held in confidence.

8. BC School Fruit and Vegetable Nutritional Program

Our school is involved in a province wide healthy living initiative. One of our goals is to encourage healthy eating by providing fresh BC fruits and vegetables to our children during class time. Our students will receive these healthy treats 13 times over the school year. Yesterday the children had the option of eating/trying blueberries.

16. Daily Health Check

Staff, other adults entering the school, parents, caregivers and students should not come to school if they are sick. It is critically important to complete a daily health check.

A daily health check means a person checking daily to ensure they (or their child) are not experiencing any symptoms of illness (including but not limited to COVID-19 symptoms) before coming to school.

Nobody should come to school if they are sick or otherwise directed to self-isolate by public health.
