# 1. PAC Snack Sale

# 2. Library News

We are very excited to be hosting a Scholastic Book Fair in our library for the first time since 2019! The Book Fair is an opportunity for students and families to purchase books. All the proceeds from the Book Fair go towards new books and resources for our Fraser Wood Library, so it is a great fundraiser that benefits all our students. Our Book Fair will be open from October 24<sup>th</sup> to 28th. There will be time for each class to come to the book fair for browsing or shopping, and it will also be open before school, at lunchtime and after school. On Wednesday, October 26th, the Book Fair will be open until 5:00 for families that would like to visit the book fair with their children.

# 3. Learn2Ride – Grade 4 and 5

Learn2Ride is an introductory cycling course sponsored by Hub Cycling, a charitable nonprofit that delivers cycling education to schools across Metro Vancouver. The learning intention of the program is to learn safe cycling skills, build confidence riding, and experience the joy of cycling. The grade 4 & 5 students at Fraser Wood will participate in this program on Monday, Oct 17 (classroom session) & Thursday, Oct 20 (outdoor session).

While the organization provides some bikes for use, students in grades 4 & 5 are encouraged to bring their own bikes to school, if possible. This will provide for an authentic learning experience on their own bikes. The program aims to teach basic road rules, safe cycling concepts, and bike handling skills. Trained instructors help students learn through interactive activities and on-bikes skills practice on the school ground.

When students bring bikes to school for the 20<sup>th</sup>, students are asked to park bikes outside their classrooms.

# 4. Affordability Fund- Financial support to make school more affordable for families that need it most.

In late August, the provincial government announced <u>\$60 million in one-time funding to</u> <u>school districts in B.C.</u> – including \$7.385 million to Surrey Schools – to make school more affordable for students and families.

Our district has now received this funding and has allocated amounts to all of our schools. Moving forward, these funds will be used to support families struggling with the rising cost of living due to inflation. We can use these funds at our school to ensure students can continue to participate fully in school, despite challenging financial situations. These funds can be used to help with school supplies, food and clothing costs, and additional fees so that students in need can take part in activities, such as field trips. Families are encouraged to reach out to the office-Ms. Kaur, Ms. de Groot, teachers, or any other staff if any financial support is needed for school-based supplies or activities.

All information shared will be held in confidence.

# 12. Daily Health Check

Staff, other adults entering the school, parents, caregivers and students should not come to school if they are sick. It is critically important to complete a daily health check.

A daily health check means a person checking daily to ensure they (or their child) are not experiencing any symptoms of illness (including but not limited to COVID-19 symptoms) before coming to school.

Nobody should come to school if they are sick or otherwise directed to self-isolate by public health.
