# 2. Air Quality Advisory For The Region

Environment Canada has issued a special air quality statement for the entire Lower Mainland, including the Surrey and White Rock areas due to "high concentrations of fine particulate matter."

The concentrations in the air are primarily due to smoke from wildfires burning in BC and Washington.

Our school district is closely monitoring the situation to ensure that our schools continue to be safe environments for our staff and students.

Our schools will limit smoke exposure for staff and students by:

• Allowing students who are sensitive to the smoke to remain indoors during lunch/breaks;

· Closing exterior doors and windows and utilizing filtered ventilation systems;

• Postpone or reduce outdoor activities, particularly strenuous activities like PE and outdoor athletic activities;

· Closely monitor students with asthma or other breathing conditions;

• Postpone extra-curricular outdoor athletic events (soccer, cross-country) for the remainder of the week if the advisory is not lifted.

# 5. Affordability Fund- Financial support to make school more affordable for families that need it most.

In late August, the provincial government announced <u>\$60 million in one-time funding to</u> <u>school districts in B.C.</u> – including \$7.385 million to Surrey Schools – to make school more affordable for students and families.

Our district has now received this funding and has allocated amounts to all of our schools. Moving forward, these funds will be used to support families struggling with the rising cost of living due to inflation. We can use these funds at our school to ensure students can continue to participate fully in school, despite challenging financial situations. These funds can be used to help with school supplies, food and clothing costs, and additional fees so that students in need can take part in activities, such as field trips.

Families are encouraged to reach out to the office- Ms. Kaur, Ms. de Groot, teachers, or any other staff if any financial support is needed for school-based supplies or activities.

All information shared will be held in confidence.

# 13. Daily Health Check

Staff, other adults entering the school, parents, caregivers and students should not come to school if they are sick. It is critically important to complete a daily health check.

A daily health check means a person checking daily to ensure they (or their child) are not experiencing any symptoms of illness (including but not limited to COVID-19 symptoms) before coming to school.

Nobody should come to school if they are sick or otherwise directed to self-isolate by public health.
