2. 2022-2023 Student Accident Insurance

Every year schools receive requests for financial assistance from parents facing medical, dental or other expenses after a student is injured at school. The school district does not provide accident insurance coverage for student injuries that occur on school property, or during school activities including extracurricular sports. If a student is injured, parents/guardians are responsible for any costs not covered by the Medical Services Plan (MSP) or their employer's health care plan.

We encourage all parents to consider student accident insurance to protect against unexpected surprises in the event of an accident or injury. For your convenience Surrey Schools has made available information on two student accident programs, that provide families the opportunity to voluntarily purchase private accident insurance for as little as \$13 for a year. The two programs are Insure My Kids and Study Insured Student Accident. Both companies offer online purchase and have provided access to applications, claims forms and full plan information. 6. Pickleball- (Notices will be distributed on Monday)

Pickleball is coming to Fraser Wood! All classes will be participating during the regular school day from September 19- September 29th.

Pickleball is a racket/paddle sport that was created by combining elements of several other racket sports. Two or four players use solid paddles to hit a perforated polymer ball over a net. The ball is much like a Wiffle ball, with 26–40 round holes. A pickleball court is

similar to badminton, with a net similar to tennis, and the paddles are similar to those in table tennis.

The cost of this activity is \$9.45 per child and is **due by Thursday, September 15**, **2022**. We encourage families to register on line with <u>School Cash Online</u>. You may also send a cheque payable to **Fraser Wood Elementary**.

No child will miss participating in an activity due to an inability to pay fees. Please contact your child's teacher or the office to make other arrangements if these fees cause you financial hardship.

7. Daily Health Check

Staff, other adults entering the school, parents, caregivers and students should not come to school if they are sick. It is critically important to complete a **daily health check**.

A daily health check means a person checking daily to ensure they (or their child) are not experiencing any symptoms of illness (including but not limited to COVID-19 symptoms) before coming to school.

Nobody should come to school if they are sick or otherwise directed to self-isolate by public health.
