Course Outline CARPENTRY & JOINERY 12
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17/18

I. COURSE DESCRIPTION

Carpentry and Joinery 12 is an advanced level course that builds on students' knowledge and skills gained from Carpentry & Joinery 11. It provides students with the opportunity to learn technological literacy, aspects of the design process, hand skills and machining processes.

II. COURSE GOALS

III. SUPPLIES REQUIRED

- Bring the **course binder with paper**, pen and a **pencil** to class. **Not a mechanical pencil.**
- Bring your **SHSS planner** to class.
