A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Students of the Cloverdale Learning Centre:

Well, Spring is in the air again and this means one thing - soon, the sun will be shining, the days are going to be warm and only several more weeks of classes before summer break is here!

It has been a busy time at CLC over the past few months and students and staff alike have been working hard to ensure success for all our learners. We continue to work on our initiatives for this year:

- "Bread Day" is becoming very popular. Thanks to the generous donations by Cob's Bread and the hard work of Wendy, our Inner City Worker, every second Tuesday, students have been able to take breads, buns and pastries home for themselves and family members.
- The Path to Graduation Program is also going well with almost 250 courses completed towards our goal of 400 for this year. If we reach the goal, students will be rewarded with a fun field trip to Cultus Lake Water Park.
- > Students continue to complete their reflection and self-assessment of core competencies. Almost all students have completed this at least once during the year and each student will complete this again in June to demonstrate growth in the areas of their goals.

Student have also participated in several activities and highlights include:

- CLC Cobras competing in the all learning centres basketball tournament and winning the championship trophy for the third consecutive year. Well done Cobras!!!
- Students going on excursions to the Railway Museum, the Surrey Museum and the Honeybee Centre.
- Visits to local post-secondary institutions have helped students better plan their way towards the future.

Interim reports were handed out in early March, just before Spring Break and I hope parents, and students, all had a chance to see the progress being made in their classes. As Term 3 comes to an end, formal reports cards will be available for pickup during parent-teacher interviews on May 1. I sincerely hope that parents will take some time to come in and speak with teachers about their child's progress this year. Interviews may be scheduled by calling the school beginning Tuesday April 23rd. The support you show for your child's education by this small gesture will go a long way to help them succeed.

With graduation and year-end coming up very quickly, the staff will be working many extra hours to prepare for a noteworthy Grad Ceremony on June 13. This year, we have also organized a formal dinner for our grads and a guest at a restaurant in White Rock. Our Grad Committee made up of several of our student leaders and Wendy Macdonald (our Inner City Worker) have been working very hard to get this organized. As the year draws to a close, teachers will be hard at work preparing for the implementation of the new Grad Program. Students and parents will continue to see a slightly different approach to learning and assessment at CLC, very similar to the Grade 10 courses put into place this year.

Ticket priority will be given to students who have paid their student & grad fees. If there are any concerns about paying the fees, please speak with the counsellor or principal as soon as possible. If you are unsure of any fees you are still owing please contact the school office.
- <u>BABY/TODDLER PHOTOS OF GRADS</u> Please supply CLC with a baby or toddler photo for the year-end graduation slideshow. The original will be returned to you.
- GRAD PHOTOS Please see Corey as soon as possible if you do not have your photo for the yearbook or Kris if your grad write-up is not done. Cut-Off for photos to make the yearbook is Tuesday May 21st. But you can still make the grad wall after that date. The photo corner is all setup and ready for drop-ins until at least May 9th and possibly right into June. 


