Career Life Education 10 is a required course for students in BC and is mandatory for high school graduation. The aim of Career Life Education 10 is to enable students to develop the skills they need to become self-directed individuals who set goals, make thoughtful decisions, and take responsibility for pursuing their goals after high school and throughout their lives.

- Understand models of decision making and innovative thinking for flexible planning and goal setting
- Understand financial planning tools, pre- and post-graduation opportunities, and local and global labour and market trends

ASSESSMENT

- 2. Focus Area Project
- 3. Post-Secondary
- 4. Career Project
- 5. Resume/Cover Letter/ Mock Interview
- 6. Finance Project

Assignments – 25%

In addition to the major projects, there will be minor assignments, daily classwork and occasional homework.

Employability Skills – 15%

This program is intended to prepare students for the "real world" and your effectiveness in the classroom will be evaluated using the same criteria: **quality of work, communication skills, ability to meet deadlines, effectiveness as a team member, classroom behaviour and participation, and general reliability.**

CLASSROOM RULES AND PROCEDURES

Cheating/Plagiarism:

• Zero tolerance policy. Anyone who plagiarizes will be immediately referred to admin.

Attendance, Lates, Absences:

- Attendance is key to being successful in this course.
- You are expected to be seated and ready to work at the bell. Students will be expected to make up missed class time at lunch or after school.
- If an absence is unavoidable, please have a parent/guardian contact the main school office
- If you are absent, it is <u>YOUR</u> responsibility to catch up on all missed work and complete all assignments.

Computer Use:

This class is taking place with the use of computers and we will be doing a large portion of the work on computers. As such, there is a huge potential for off-task behaviour when students spend their time on websites such as Youtube or playing online games during the work period. **Students found using any websites deemed off-task will lose computer privileges** for a length of time at the discretion of the teacher. If losing computer privileges prevents you from completing your work, you must make arrangements to complete the assignment on your own time. If the problem persists, a phone call will be made home to discuss this with parents, and the student will be referred to the administration.

Cell Phone Use:

The use of cell phones is not permitted in class. Keep phones turned off and in your bag.

Food/Drink:

Because we will be working with computers regularly, food and drink (except for water) are not permitted in class.

Washroom Breaks:

Students may only leave the classroom with the teachers' permission. Only one student is permitted to leave class at a time. If a student abuses their washroom privileges (wanders hallways, exceeds more than 5 min, goes to cafeteria to get food) then washroom privileges will be taken away for a period of time at the discretion of the teacher.
