The following expectations will be maintained throughout the entire co-op experience:

- 1. A goal of the program is to provide meaningful work experience that will provide students the opportunity to develop career skills and explore career options. Each student should (in consultation with his/her parent/guardian) have seriously considered what type of work placement would be most beneficial to him/her.
- 2. Holidays and other absences are strongly discouraged during the co-op semester as they make it very difficult to successfully complete the program.
- 3. Due to the limited number of students accepted into co-op and the difficulty in re-scheduling students who withdraw, students are encouraged to seriously consider their commitment to completing the program before they return this form.
- 4. The student will be expected to complete two three-week work placements. These work placements will require the students to work a regular workday (8 hours) five days a week. Part-time jobs and other extra-curricular activities can be accommodated during the work experience, but these need to be arranged before a placement is finalized.
- 5. It is the student's responsibility to transport himself/herself to and from his/her work placement. The location of the student's placement is decided in consultation with the student. Students need to make the teacher aware of any potential travel restrictions at the beginning of the co-op semester.
- 6. Students must have outstanding attendance while in the co-op program.
- 7. Each student is expected to abide by the school's Code of Conduct while in co-op and on work experiences. Excellent behavior, work ethic, attendance, and punctuality are expected. Failure to uphold these expectations may result in removal from work experiences and a failing grade will be assigned.
- 8. Students will be expected to be self-motivated as the program is demanding.
- 9. Students will be expected to use professional language and appropriate manners in the classroom and on the work experiences. Appropriate attire and grooming are mandatory for all work placements.
- 10. Students will be expected to communicate effectively with employers regarding expectations, safety, attendance and other information. It is <u>MANDATORY</u> that students contact the employer and the school for any absences.
