### **Program Overview**

Co-Op will run in the Fall of 2021 and will consist of the following 4 courses:

- CLC 11
- Physics 11

- Pre-Calc Math 11
- Work Experience 12A

Students will work with one cohort of up to 30 students, and one teacher for the duration of the program. Students will return to their regular coursework in the Spring.

The work experience will be "full immersion", meaning all other coursework will stop for a period of time while students complete their placements. This allows for greater flexibility in the experience opportunities students can take part in.

#### **Co-Op Expectations Form**

The Co-Op Program is unique in both its presentation style and experiences. As a result, students need to be aware of the high expectations that are set for all students participating in the program. *By signing below, students & guardians agree to the following:* 

- 1. **Attendance:** This is especially important during the Co-Op Program. Extended vacations are greatly discouraged and may interfere with the Work Experience Placements. It is important that students stay on pace with the rest of the class, and be in attendance each day.
- 2. Work Experience Placements: The Career Facilitators will work hard to ensure that students get a placement that is in alignment with the student's interests. We can not guarantee any placements as they are subject to availability and many other factors that are often out of the control of the Career Facilitators. Also, when students do attend their placements, they are expected to good ambassadors of the school, by following the employer's guidelines and working hard during their time there.
- 3. Work Experience Hours & Transportation: Students will complete 100 hours for their work experience and will be given class time to facilitate this. Some placements will require students to work outside of the regular school hours. Therefore, students need to be flexible with their personal schedules during this time. Students (and guardians) must also be aware that it is their responsibility to transport the student to and from their placement each day. This could include driving them, or helping them learn to take the bus or SkyTrain.
- 4. *Communication:* Consistent and effective communication is paramount in the Co-Op Program, especially during the work experience when students are not on site. This allows the teacher to plan out their visits with the students, and get regular updates from the students while not in class.
