# H.T. Thrift Elementary School

Code of Conduct -2021/22

At H.T. Thrift Elementary School, we believe that all children have the right to learn in a safe,



caring and orderly environment. Our expectations are that students will maintain an attitude that is cooperative, courteous and respectful. Students are expected to follow the guidelines outlined in the Code of Conduct in classrooms, in the school building, on school grounds and at school functions; regardless of their location. The staff assist students in developing skills for resolving conflict, problem solving and decision making appropriate to their age for healthy learning and living. The school will notify parents of any serious breaches of the code of conduct.

The H.T. Thrift Code of Conduct centers around all students

understanding and showing:

- respect for self
- respect for others
- respect for their surroundings

## **INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOUR**

Inappropriate behaviour may consist of, but is not limited to:

- being inside without a reason, running in halls
- chewing gum
- · lack of respect toward staff, visitors to our school and/or fellow students

Inappropriate behaviour may have one or more of the following consequences:

- problem solving discussion
- school/community service
- parent contact/meeting
- verbal warning

# **UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOUR**

Unacceptable behaviour can consist of, but is not limited to: destruction of school or personal property

- fighting
- stealing
- vandalism
- teasing/bullying/cyber bullying
- intimidation, making threats

recess/lunch restriction

time-out location

- being out of bounds

refusal to comply or rudeness

- snowballing or face washing
- swearing or using obscene gestures

violence of any form

Unacceptable behaviour may result in an in-school or out-of-school suspension of the student(s) involved.



# PROHIBITED BEHAVIOURS

The following behaviours may result in an out-of-school suspension of the student(s) involved:

- use or possession of illegal substances (i.e.: drugs, tobacco, alcohol, fireworks etc.)
- use or possession of weapons and or replica weapons •
- acts of harassment, discrimination or abuse (verbal, physical, sexual) •
- retribution against others for reporting

## Student's must not be in possession of, or bring the following items to school:

real weapons

- toy or replica weapons
- matches or lighters
- caps, firecrackers, fireworks, cigarettes, drugs or alcohol

# **CONSEQUENCES**

Consequences will be applied in a fair and consistent manner. Depending upon the severity, the age and maturity of the student, and other factors, one or more of the following actions will be taken:

verbal warning

- school/community service
- problem solving/restitution discussion parent contact/meeting
  - referral for counseling or behaviour support
- recess and/or lunch restrictions in-school suspension
- out-of-school suspension

# **NOTIFICATION**

As circumstances warrant, the principal has a responsibility to advise other parties following a behaviour incident:

- parent of student exhibiting major behaviours
- parent of student on the receiving end
- Assistant Superintendent, Safe Schools team member and/or other District Staff
- ministerial agencies and/or School Liaison Officer (Police)

# SCHOOL DRESS CODE

According to Surrey School District Policy #9410 - Safe and Caring Schools; there is flexibility for schools to adopt a dress code that attempts to balance individual liberty, social convention, functionality, community standards and school community values.

At H.T. Thrift we believe that school should be treated as a "place of business". Staff model, teach and prepare students for high school and eventually the world of work. We understand that children enjoy dressing to suit their individuality and we encourage this, within reason. Our expectations are:

- Clothing is free of negative, inappropriate symbols, pictures or slogans
- Beach wear (excessively short shorts, bare midriff and flip-flops) are not to be worn. Flip-flops are a tripping hazards.
- Undergarments are not to be visible
- Hats, caps may be worn in the individual classrooms, if the teacher approves. They ARE NOT to be worn in other areas in the school. Hoodies must not be pulled up over heads

## **VISITORS**

All visitors to our school are required to sign in at the office and receive a visitor badge. The School District has detailed procedures in place should an intruder or trespasser enter the building. Staff and students are familiar with these procedures.
