### BACKPACK BUDDIES - \$497,131

A huge thank you to Backpack Buddies for their incredible support of weekend food hampers for Surrey schools.

Thanks to Backpack Buddies, over 34,000 food hampers were distributed to more than 900 children across the district during the 2025–2026 school year, helping ensure students had reliable access to food every weekend.
