What Every Parent Should Know About Grade 8

Come to the school every occasion you can.

Don't make it a foreign place. You will feel more comfortable the more often you are in the school.

Display an interest in school and what goes on here. Learn teachers' names in the first few weeks of school – ask to see your child's timetable. (Instead of asking, "What did you learn in school today?" try "What did Mrs.?? do in your class today?")

Download the FP Dragons App. You will be able to access the school's newsfeed, announcements, resources and contact information.

Register your email address on our Website and keep current with upcoming events in the school through our website calendar (www.surreyschools.ca/schools/fltsec), the FP Dragons APP and various social media, such as Instagram (FPSSDragons).

Check your student's agenda everyday.

All Grade 8 students receive a school agenda, which should be used by the student daily and checked by guardians daily.

Encourage completion of homework and assignments.

If you aren't able to assist with the actual homework, organize a quiet time and place for the homework to be done. Assist your child in keeping their binder(s) organized.

Look at the course outlines, evaluation methods, etc.

Every student should receive an outline for each course at the beginning of the semester.

Review the report card and Learning Update with your child.

Look at the work habits and comment sections as well as the marks – reinforce the positive – make a plan for improvement – listen to explanations.

Bring your child with you to Parent/Teacher Learning Conferences. Include them in the discussions.

Attend all Parent Advisory Council (PAC) Meetings.

The more you learn about the school, and the more you participate within the school, the more comfortable you become.

Let your child develop independence gradually – but keep a parental eye on them.

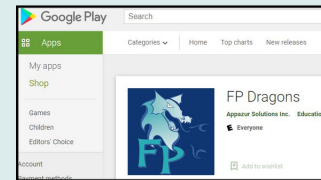
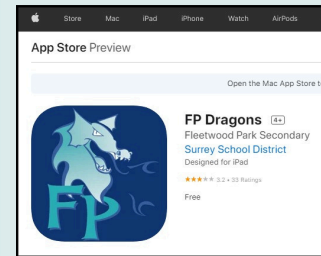
Remember, teachers want your child to succeed and care about their success. Encourage your child, counsel them, or get in touch with the school to arrange extra help. Work with the school.

Fleetwood Park Secondary Special Programs

At Fleetwood Park Secondary, a variety of programs are available to provide additional support for students with special needs. It is crucial that appropriate documentation and current psycho-ed testing is in place for all incoming Grade 8 students. Appropriate timetabling and special programming designation is dependent upon this necessary documentation.

English Language Learners (ELL)

The ELL Welcome Centre provides assessment tests to all incoming ELL students. Reading, Vocabulary, and Writing Assessments form a composite score that gives the student an ELL category: Starting, Emerging, Developing, Expanding, Bridging. After establishing the students' level of language, they are assigned classes appropriate to their level. ELL 1 (Beginning/Developing) and ELL 2 (Developing/Expanding) students may receive up to four ELL classes while ELL 3 (Expanding/Consolidating) students may receive up to three ELL classes. All students are tested annually. Incoming grade 8 students have already been tested at their elementary school. Please contact Department Head Ms. Sandra Park if you have students that still require ELL testing.

ELL Courses Offered:

ELL 1 (Beginning/Developing) Students will work on building a foundation for language and literacy skills – reading, writing and oral communication. Emphasis will be on increasing vocabulary and sentence structure.

ELL 2 (Developing/Expanding) Students will continue to strengthen their language and literacy skills – reading, writing and oral communication. Emphasis will be on grammar, complex sentence structures, and the writing process.

ELL 3 (Expanding/Consolidating) Students will work on mastering language and literacy skills – reading, writing and oral communication. Emphasis will be on increasing comprehension and academic writing

Learner Support Team (LST)

Fleetwood Park Learner Support Team (LST) seeks to support designated (LD) students and struggling learners who require additional curricular support in the regular classroom by using a variety of interventions. Our LST department seeks to provide support based on an inclusive model where in-class support is provided wherever possible. Assistance is provided through collaboration with classroom teachers, small group pullouts and in-class assistance.

Students may be offered an LST Support block where they may receive assistance with their class work and work on building literacy, numeracy, organizational and self-advocacy skills. Grade 8's are placed in these courses on the recommendation of the grade 7 teacher and through review of our School Based Team.

BASES (District Program)

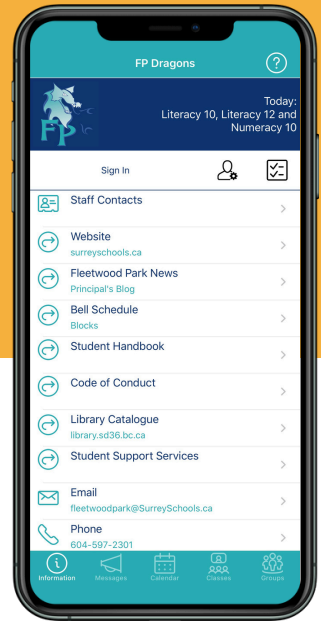
Students with mild or moderate intellectual disabilities may be referred to the BASES Program. Referrals must be submitted to Student Services by the elementary school. Please ensure all testing (Psycho Ed and Adaptive Measure) is done to facilitate this transition by Student Services.

Creating Your Password

Criteria

- 8-14 characters
- Minimum 1 uppercase letter, minimum 1 lowercase letter
- Minimum 1 number
- Minimum 1 special symbol or character: # or \$ or ! or @
- Your password **cannot** contain: first name, middle name, last name, date of birth, personal id or sequential letters or numbers

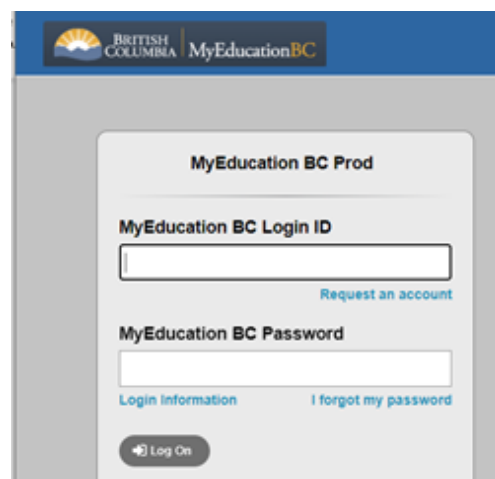

- MyEd BC will email you a new temporary password.



About Passwords

- Passwords are valid for 90 days.
- After 90 days, you will be prompted to create a new password immediately.
- Ten unsuccessful login attempts will disable your account. If this happens you will have to wait for it to be re-enabled.
- Call the school office to request that your account be reactivated.
- Need a password reset? Did you receive an email with MyEd BC login information? Please contact the school office at fleetwoodpark@surreyschools.ca.

As your child progresses through secondary school, your involvement remains a key part of their success. We encourage all families to regularly check and familiarize themselves with the [MyED Parent Portal](#). This portal is an essential tool for staying informed and engaged in your child's education.

Through the Parent Portal, you can:

- **View learning updates** - Monitor progress and celebrate achievements. February 11th will be the second Learning Update
- **Monitor your child's attendance records** - Know when your child is in class and address any concerns early.
- **Class schedules & teachers names** – Stay informed about your child's daily routine and the teachers name for when booking parent teacher meetings. November 5th is the first Parent Teacher Meetings.

The team has battled hard so far, and we look forward to their successes in playoffs!

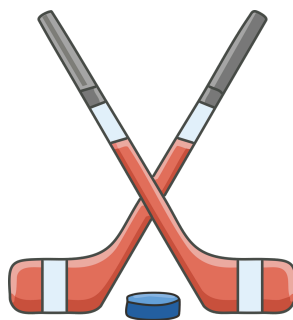

School Fee Schedule Information 2026-2027

Parents/Caregivers and students are advised of the following optional enhancement fees for the 2026/2027 school year. The school will provide basic materials and resources free of charge necessary for students to meet the general requirements for graduation. Students will need to provide their own basic supplies and equipment for their own personal use at school. This includes supplies such as paper, writing tools, calculators, notebooks, gym attire, sewing kits, and some other items needed for various electives. Fees will differ from school to school, as each secondary school is unique in the educational programs and courses and extra-curricular activities offered.

A. Student Activity Fee

This fee is charged to all students and is \$20 per student. Typical activities supported by these fees are:
- Student agenda/app, student council events, clubs, athletics, locks, and student events

B. Optional Enhancements – Educational Programs

Optional fees can be charged for materials or goods that are in addition to what would be necessary for the student to meet the expected outcomes in a course.

C. Optional Enhancements – Extra-curricular | Activities

Optional fees can be charged for extra-curricular activities, events and goods where participation or attendance is **not** mandatory as part of a course or program.

For further information on fees see **Appendix A** on page 3.

1. **Payments:** Surrey Schools use [Schools Cash Online](#) as an easy to use, convenient and safe way for parents and caregivers to pay for their children’s school fees. To pay by cash/cheque please contact the school office.
2. **Receipts:** The individual who paid for the item using [Schools Cash Online](#) will receive confirmation of the purchase on screen once payment has been successfully processed. You can print a copy of the electronic receipt by clicking the “Print” icon. This information is also recorded in the “Payment History” tab. A receipt will also be emailed to the email address associated with the system account.
3. **Refunds:** Any refunds issued for fees by the school will be sent using [School Cash Online](#), contact your school office if you would like to request refunds for any items purchased.
4. **Financial Hardship:** The district’s hardship policy is an important part of our fees. No student will be denied the ability to participate in any part of the school’s educational programs because of an inability to pay. If you wish to discuss the implications of any fee on your child’s learning, please contact the principal.

Appendix A: Additional Information School Fees

Instruction is provided free of charge to all students registered in a school's educational program sufficient to meet the general requirements of graduation, and the school shall provide free of charge any resource material necessary to participate in that program. The School Act permits the charging of fees for certain items. Please refer to the District [Policy 9802](#) and [Procedure 9802.1](#) for more information about school fees. Any school fees will be communicated to parents and students of each school's community on an annual basis.

Optional Enhancements – Educational Programs

Workbooks

Workbooks are optional enhancements to educational programs. These workbooks are designed for a student's personal use as they will write in the books during the course of instruction. Where a workbook is regularly used as part of a course and a student does not wish to purchase their own workbook, one will be provided and the student will not be permitted to write in the workbook.

Where there is an optional fee for a workbook, that fee will match as close as reasonably possible to the exact cost of the workbook to the school.

Materials consumed in a course

In courses that consume materials (e.g. art, cooking, woodworking, metalwork, science) schools can only charge for materials or goods that are in addition to what would be necessary for the student to meet the expected outcomes in a course. If a student is going beyond the basic requirements of a course and creating projects for personal use (e.g. creating a table of mahogany rather than plywood), then the student may bring their own materials from home or the cost for the materials for these enhanced projects may be recovered through a fee.

Textbook or Calculator Deposits

In accordance with the School Act, the Board may require deposits for educational resource materials, such as textbooks, novels and other resource materials. The Board will refund all of the deposit to the student upon return of the educational resource materials in good condition. Students will be advised of terms of the deposit at the time the deposit is required. Waiver procedures must be in place for all deposits.

Uniforms

Students sometimes need special clothing (uniforms for band or for cafeteria) to participate in an educational program. These clothes are not a requirement to participate in a program but are logical savings for parents where clothes could be soiled or damaged in shops or the cafeteria. If the clothes (e.g. band or choir uniforms) are owned by the school, a fully refundable deposit may be required to ensure the return in good condition.

Musical Instruments

A board may charge a fee for the rental of a musical instrument for the student's personal use or the student may provide their own instrument when he/she is part of a fine arts class or a course with a musical component.

Specialty Academies

Some schools have "specialty academies" which are educational programs that emphasize a particular sport, activity or subject area. All academies require consultation with the Parent Advisory Council of a school and approval of the Board of Education. As part of the Board approval, a specific fee may be charged to support the academy and that fee must be directly related to the activities that are above and beyond a standard educational program. See page 5 for approved fees.

International Baccalaureate (IB)

The IB program is based on standards and curriculum developed by the International Baccalaureate Organization. This program meets all requirements of our province and also offers additional opportunities and enhancements. A Board may charge a fee for students enrolled in an IB program for direct costs that are above and beyond the costs required for a standard educational program. These fees must be published on an annual basis. See page 5 for approved fees.

Students in Apprenticeship Programs

Where students participate in a trades program that results in certification or is part of an Industry Training Authority apprenticeship, fees may be charged for the rental of tools, equipment and materials necessary for participation in the program or the Board may require the student to purchase their own tools, equipment and materials required for the program.

Certification

Some programs include a component that offers an external certificate recognizing unique qualifications. Examples are St. John's First Aid, Food Safe, Superhost, and Worldhost. These certificates help prepare students for employment and schools charge a fee to recover the cost of certification.

Examinations

Some programs offer external examinations where students can obtain credit for post-secondary institutions as a result of successfully completing the exam. International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement are examples. Where students take these exams, a fee is charged to recover the cost of the examination.

Optional Enhancements – Extra-Curricular Activities

Graduation Ceremonies

The graduation ceremony is an important tradition that represents the end of a student's school experience. Costs do apply as these extracurricular events are hosted in a variety of venues across the district and different traditions and formats require different levels of student costs. No student will be denied the ability to participate in a graduation ceremony due to an inability to pay the cost.

Yearbooks

Yearbooks are common in schools and are optional. The cost for a yearbook for a school shall be directly related to the development and publishing costs of the yearbook.

Athletics

Participation in athletics and organized sports is an important part of a school's culture. Each secondary school is unique in the sports offered and the levels at which they participate. Students can expect a cost for participation which is dependent on the level of the sport, the number of games or tournaments played, the travel involved as well as other factors including fees for referees which are paid by the school. A significant portion of the costs associated with athletics go to the provincial bodies that organize these events. Every attempt is made to keep costs to a minimum and it is normal practice to have parents pay in a lump sum at the beginning of any one sport season so parents understand the true costs involved for full participation.

Field trips

Students may be charged fees for expenses such as transportation, accommodation, meals, entrance fees and equipment rentals for optional field trips, or other extracurricular outings or events. Students will not be charged fees for any field studies/field trips where attendance is mandatory as part of a course or program.

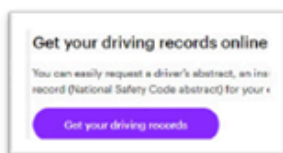

Obtaining a Drivers' Abstract:

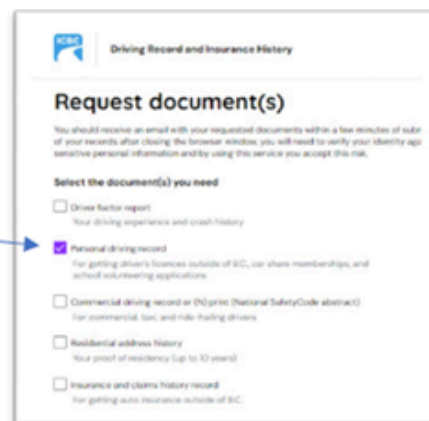

RE: E-bikes and e-scooters on school property

As we settle into the new school year, we are bringing your attention to important safety concerns about the use of e-scooters and e-bikes on Surrey Schools property.

Recently, the [City of Surrey announced](#) e-scooters are not permitted on public property – including roadways, sidewalks or public parks within Surrey. The City also published concerns regarding improper storage and charging, leading to the potential risk of fire or explosion.

As a result, Surrey Schools will not permit the use or storage of electric scooters on Surrey Schools property.

Electric Scooters

As you may know, the Province of British Columbia launched the E-Scooter Pilot Project (the “Pilot”) on April 5, 2024. Under this initiative, e-scooters may only be used on public roads in municipalities that are participating in the Pilot. Please note that the cities of Surrey and White Rock are not participating municipalities. [According to provincial guidance, electric scooters cannot be ridden on public roads or sidewalks in municipalities not included in the Pilot.](#)

In addition, our school communities have raised the following concerns:

- **Safety:** Repeated concerns from Surrey Schools staff, parents, and the wider community regarding speed around vehicles and younger children and a lack of helmets.
- **Storage:** Issues related to misplaced, stolen, or damaged electric scooters. Surrey Schools is not responsible for the loss, theft, or damage of personal property brought onto school district premises ([Surrey Schools Policy 5809](#)).

E-Bikes

With respect to e-bikes, the [Motor Assisted Cycle \(E-Bike\) Regulation](#) outlines specific legal requirements, including age restrictions. As a reminder:

- Students must be at least **14 years old** to ride a light e-bike.
- Students must be at least **16 years old** to ride a standard e-bike.

E-Bikes and E-Scooters



Please review the definitions of standard and light e-bikes to ensure compliance: [E-bike requirements](#).

Surrey Schools expects students to dismount e-bikes when on school property. In addition, e-bikes may not be charged at school or stored inside school buildings.

Final Note

This is an evolving landscape with restrictive regulations for children and youth. We encourage parents and guardians to carefully review the applicable regulations before permitting their child to use an e-scooter on private property: [E-scooter rules and safety](#).

A reminder as we move forward, as per [Surrey Schools Policy 5809](#), Surrey Schools is not responsible for the loss, theft, or damage of personal property, including e-scooters and e-bikes brought onto school property.
