Economics is the study and social science of how society uses its limited resources and develops an analytical approach to understanding issues such as, what determines the price of different products, to the causes, and consequences of unemployment, to the benefits of different forms of competition.

As our world becomes increasingly integrated by trade, finance, and commerce, this course will give students the competitive edge required to survive financially outside the classroom. This course is designed to help students gain knowledge and expand on the economic landscape outside our classroom walls in which society lives and works.
