

English 11 and 12 are the most important courses you will take.



Your Math course is the next most important course.



Other specific courses (Grade 11 and/or Grade 12 courses) which may be determined by the program or faculty in which you apply.



You must do your research because the admission requirements vary so greatly.



- ***ENGLISH 12**
- *PRE-CALCULUS 12 (*recommended)
- *Calculus 12 recommended
- *A minimum of two (or more) approved courses (accepted in the use of calculation of admission average)

ARTS/HUMANITIES/SOCIAL SCIENCES PROGRAMS

The following is a generalization (as every post-secondary institution's requirements are different) of admission requirements:

- ❖ENGLISH 12 (a minimum %age may be required)
- ❖Some universities require a minimum %age in a particular Math 11 courses (CHECK!!!)
- A minimum of three (or more) approved courses (accepted in the use of calculation of admission average)

** Faculty of Arts students may be required to take the equivalent of a Grade 12 Language course during their university career.


- **PHYSICS** 11
- **CHEMISTRY 11**
- A MINIMUM %AGE IN PRE-CALCULUS 11 may also be required
- ***ENGLISH 12**
- **♦PRE-CALCULUS 12**
- *At least ONE Science 12 (dependent on the PSI)
- *Calculus 12 recommended
- *A minimum of two (or more) approved courses (accepted in the use of calculation of admission average)

Academic (minimum grade needed in brackets)

1. One of:

- BC secondary school graduation (or the equivalent in another school system)
- One course short of BC secondary school graduation
- 19 years old by the end of the first month of the first semester of attendance
- 17 years old on the first day of the first semester of attendance and has not been in school for at least one year
- Completion of a certificate or equivalent from a special needs program and has been in school for 12 years

2. One of:

- English 12 (B)
- English Studies 12 (B)
- English First Peoples 12 (B)
- equivalent*

3. One of:

- Biology 11 (B) or 12 (B)
- Life Sciences 11 (B)
- Anatomy and Physiology 12 (B)
- equivalent*

4. Foundations of Math 11 (B) or 12 (B) or equivalent*

Note (*): university transferable course work in the above subject areas may be used towards meeting the entrance requirements.





COURSE SELECTION PROCESS

- You will have access to MyED to enter your courses online from January 13 -24.
- Students will receive their course selection sheets today.
- Please take a photo of your completed course selection sheet and hand your sheet back to your counsellor, who will review this and can still make changes to your requests after MyED is closed to students.
- Counsellors will see you during your CLE 10 block or your English 11 block. If you do not have these courses in your schedule, please book an appointment.
- Do your best to make thoughtful choices before entering course requests.

IB DP COURSE SELECTION

GRADE 10 INTO 11

- Complete course selection for IB DP with your application package.
- Indicate by checking the box on your course selection and hand in this sheet at the end of the presentation

GRADE 11 INTO 12

- Carry on with your current courses, excluding French or Spanish because you will be writing your exams in the Spring (of your Grade 11 year).
- Connect with your counsellor and IB Coordinator (Ms. Wilcox) if you are not meeting IB DP requirements.



As you move through the graduation program

- Academic classes require pre-requisite skills which are usually associated with good marks and work habits.
 - To be successful in Pre-Calculus 11: you should earn >4's in Foundations of Math and Pre-Calculus 10.
 - To be successful in Chemistry 11 and Physics 11, you should earn >4's in Foundations of Math and Pre-Calculus 10
 AND Science 10.
 - For Pre-Calculus 12, you should earn a "B" (minimum 73%) in Pre-Calculus 11.
 - For Physics 12 => "B" in Pre-Calculus 11


AND "B" in Physics 11

For Chemistry 12 => "B" in Pre-Calculus 11

AND "B" in Chemistry 11

THINGS TO CONSIDER

- ❖ The school-work WILL become more difficult!
- ❖ Teacher and instructor expectations evolve. Course demands evolve. Your study strategies and work habits <u>must</u> also evolve.
- ❖ The IB Learner Profile and Approaches to Learning skills are especially important.
 - Communication and Collaboration Skills
 - Research, Critical and Creative Thinking Skills
 - Time Management and Organization Skills
 - Self-Management taking care of yourself



FINANCING POST SECONDARY

SCHOLARSHIPS

A grant, payment, or monetary award based on some merit or achievement.

STUDENT LOANS

Based on financial need and must be repaid.

RESP

Family savings plan plus government top-up.

BURSARIES

A monetary award based on financial need and merit.

EMPLOYERS PAY

Some employers will fund PSI upgrading and other training

PART-TIME EMPLOYMENT

Many students work part time while attending post-secondary.
