Who We Are – Film Making for the 21st Century

Course: 8 credits

Rationale: Multimedia careers are on the rise in British Columbia and students at Ecole Salish Secondary need a program to develop skills and experience the work environment to make educated decisions for the future.

- Students will choose to focus in 2 streams from the following:

- Students will practice and develop skills through small projects and will complete a final video project that defines WHO WE ARE.


Highlights of the program:

- Development of digital portfolio to assist with post-secondary applications




Are you interested in igniting your passion to make change in the world?

• Community leadership runs within the school day. In this class you will explore your own leadership skills, develop activities and programs to build Salish community, and work with community programs like food banks and community outreach activities to build service projects of your choosing.
