- 3) Cmolik Scholarship Students who have lived in Canada for at least seven years and have experienced adversity in their lives are eligible to apply. They may not have top grades through high school but must be capable of succeeding at the post-secondary level. Grade 12's are encouraged to speak to their counselor if they think they are a good fit.
