Kindergarten Registrations for the 2022-2023 School Year

It's time to register for Kindergarten. Children who will turn 5 years old before January 1, 2023, are eligible to begin school in September 2022. Registration will begin on Monday, January 10, 2022.

The Surrey School District is now using a web-based online registration form. Please go to this link:

You will need to upload the following documents: when registering:

- Proof of Birth Date for the student (birth certificate or passport)
- Proof of Guardianship (as shown on child's birth certificate or other appropriate legal documentation)
- Proof of Citizenship for both parent and the student (Birth Certificate, Citizenship Card, Passport, Landed Immigrant Document, Permanent Resident Card)
- Proof of Residence (Purchase or Rental Agreement, Cable, Hydro or Gas bill)
- Student immunization records

If you know of any children in the neighborhood who will be attending Kindergarten next year, and they do not have children attending North Ridge at this time, please pass on this information.

Talking About Emotions

When we talk to children about emotional experiences, it helps them learn how emotions affect people. It also teaches them how to repair emotional mistakes. This is an important part of the way they learn to understand and manage their own feelings.

Example: Selina is dancing around the living room when she bumps into her father and he spills his coffee. Her father is angry and yells at her to settle down. Then, he feels badly about what he said and apologizes to her. "Oh, Selina, I am sorry. I know that it was an accident." Selina starts to turn away, but her father continues. "When people are upset, sometimes they do things that they wish they hadn't. I should have waited a few seconds to calm down before saying something."

Be A Role Model

How you manage your own emotions is a powerful lesson for your children. Watch what you say when you are upset. When you are angry with your children or your partner, take time to cool down. Let your children see you taking deep breaths to control your feelings. You teach your kids strategies by modeling them in real life situations.

Coast Salish Shelter

Did you know the Coast Salish lived in longhouses near the mouth of a river or a sheltered bay? The longhouse faced the beach to see if enemies were coming. They were made from massive cedar planks to withstand storms. There were no windows and one door at the end of the longhouse. There was a fire pit in the center and a hole in the roof to let the smoke out. Did you know that there were two levels in the Coast Salish longhouse? It can fit 20 to 40 relatives. Have you heard that the Coast Salish named their house and the family totem was in the front of the house? By Abhay, Div. 11

Coast Salish Food

Did you know the Coast Salish ate mostly salmon, clams and oysters? The clams were dug from the beach and the meat inside were smoked. The Coast Salish used oil of the Oolichan (smelt) to give more flavor to food. It also kept food from spoiling and binded fishcakes and berry cakes. The Coast Salish also ate other fish, deer, elk, moose, bear, roots, herbs, and berries. Did you know that they used soapberries to make drinks and ice cream?

Coast Salish Tools

Have you heard that the red cedar was used by the Coast Salish for canoes, houses, clothing, baskets, and tools? Did you know that the red cedar is called the "tree of life"? The Coast Salish used a tool called a weir to catch fish. The weir is a fence-like structure made from wood. The fish got stuck in the weir and then speared. The Coast Salish made knives from sharpened seashells. They sharpened their blades with wet sand. Did you know that they used a sharp and hard piece of wood called a "digging stick" to plant seeds and to dig clams?
