The school was a hub of activity this week. Tuesday evening we had our Aboriginal Families dinner. We had a larger number of people out this year and thank you to Ms. Johnson for cooking a delicious turkey and salmon dinner. Thank you to Ms. Courtenay and Ms. Baumgartner for organizing the event. We had several staff out to help with the event from set up to clean up. It was another wonderful event for our community.

Wednesday was a hectic day with a few groups coming to tour the school. We had a pair of district administrators from Halifax and Baltimore here to see the school. They were very excited with what they witnessed as they walked through pods and talked to teachers and students. We also had a group from Argyle Secondary come through the school. Argyle is being rebuilt using the same design as Salish. The teachers were very curious to see how we are using the design to engage students in their learning. Finally, we had our elementary Principals visit to discuss articulation for our 2020 class of Grade 8s. Amid all the visitors, we had a great interdisciplinary lesson going on in the Foods room. It was a Social Studies 9, Foods 9 collaborative effort that engaged students in understanding more deeply the Aboriginal perspective when studying the Fur Trade.

Thursday night the gym was full for our Holiday Music Concert. It was the first of two nights of performances for our music students. We enjoyed the music performed by our Concert Bands this past Thursday. Next week, it will be the Jazz Band's opportunity to play in the more intimate setting of the Theatre. The performance will start at 7pm.
