Weather Update

Talking About Emotions

When we talk to children about emotional experiences, it helps them learn how emotions affect people. It also teaches them how to repair emotional mistakes. This is an important part of the way they learn to understand and manage their own feelings.

Example: Selina is dancing around the living room when she bumps into her father and he spills his coffee. Her father is angry and yells at her to settle down. Then, he feels badly about what he said and apologizes to her. "Oh, Selina, I am sorry. I know that it was an accident." Selina starts to turn away but her father continues. "When people are upset, sometimes they do things that they wish they hadn't. I should have waited a few seconds to calm down before saying something."

Be A Role Model

How you manage your own emotions is a powerful lesson for your children. Watch what you say when you are upset. When you are angry with your children or your partner, take time to cool down. Let your children see you taking deep breaths to control your feelings. You teach your kids strategies by modeling them in real life situations.



Kindergarten Registrations for the 2019-2020 School Year

It's time to register for Kindergarten. Children who will turn 5 years old before January 1, 2020, are eligible to begin school in September 2019.

Registration for Kindergarten will begin after 9:00 am on Monday, January 14, 2019.

Upon registration at the school, please bring the following documents:

- Proof of Birth Date for the student (birth certificate or passport)
- Proof of Guardianship (as shown on child's birth certificate or other appropriate legal documentation)
- Proof of Citizenship for both parent and the student (Birth Certificate, Citizenship Card, Passport, Landed Immigrant Document, Permanent Resident Card)
- Proof of Residence (Purchase or Rental Agreement, Cable, Hydro or Gas bill)
- Student immunization records

If you know of any children in the neighborhood who will be attending Kindergarten next year, and they do not have children attending North Ridge at this time, please pass on this information.
