About the Scholarship

District/Authority Scholarship is awarded to 5,500 high school graduates who have demonstrated excellence in their chosen area.

The Ministry of Education sets basic eligibility requirements and general guidelines; local scholarships committees determine awarding criteria and select their conditional recipients.

The Ministry confirms that the selected students have satisfied basic criteria and then sends these confirmed recipients a \$1,250 scholarship voucher that they can redeem with the Ministry of Education after they are attending a designated post-secondary institution or B.C. authorized trades training provider.

Students have five years to redeem their District/Authority scholarship vouchers; an expiry date is printed on each voucher and extensions are not possible.

Key Dates

- Spring: conditional recipients notified by their district/authority
- September: conditional recipients checked against eligibility requirements
- November: paper scholarship vouchers mailed to confirmed recipients

Eligibility Requirements

Student selected as conditional recipients of the District/Authority scholarship must satisfy the following requirements **by August 31st of their graduating year** to be confirmed as a recipient and receive their scholarship voucher.

- Meet basic eligibility requirements
 - Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident (landed immigrant) at the time of registration in the school year for which the scholarship is awarded
 - Be a BC resident
 - Be or have been in the school year for which the scholarship is awarded:
 - Enrolled in a British Columbia public school (including Distributed Learning schools), or
 - Enrolled in a Group 1, 2, or 4 British Columbia Independent School, or
 - Enrolled in a Continuing Education Center, or
 - Registered with a public independent, francophone or distributed learning school in BC as a homeschooled child
 - Be graduating (by August 31) in the same year the scholarship is awarded
- Fulfill the graduation requirements of either the BC Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma) or the BC Adult Graduation Diploma (Adult Dogwood): and,
- Meet criteria determined by the student’s local scholarship committee including demonstration of outstanding achievement in one of the areas listed below.

Area of Interest	Examples
Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies	Business, Home Economics, Media Arts, Technology, Tourism
Community Service (Volunteer Activity)	Includes awareness of local, global, and cultural issues
Fine Arts	Dance, Drama, Music, Visual Arts
Indigenous Languages and Culture	Demonstrated at school or in the community
Languages	External Assessments or Languages Curriculum, including AP and IB courses
Physical Activity (and Health)	Athletics, Dance, Gymnastics
Technical and Trades Training	Coding, Culinary Arts, Mechanics, Robotics, Woodwork
