****Call to order at 7:05pm****

1. Administration report
 - a. There will be budget cuts for the 2021-2022 school year
 - b. We're seeing budget cuts impacting Salish with the Youth Care timetable
 - c. We are over enrollment projections by about 100 students for next year. District is saying we will have 1134 students next year, however we have 1240 in the system.
 - d. Finalizing the timetables and teachers in the school likely won't happen until the end of September once the student enrollment has been finalized and we know our student numbers.
 - e. Ecole Salish Secondary was asked to participate in a study on blended learning model. Mme. Hammond is looking for parent participation on a phone interview. Please contact admin if you would like to participate.

Questions for Administration:

- With the recent PHO being announced, how does that impact school opening in September? What changes do we expect? What safety measures will be kept in place for September?
 - We are planning for a quarter system and a semester system
 - Currently, we are planning for a quarter system for the start of the year, but we must be ready to start the school year with semesters. We will await an announcement in August.
 - Likely will not need to put students in cohorts
 - Students will most likely be able to move more freely in school
 - Still waiting to hear updates about the daily wearing of masks

- Now that course selection is finalized, are there any changes to the timetable for next year, ie. classes that you are unable to offer due to low enrollment.
 - Timetable has been set for a couple months, and there has been no changes since we finalized it in May
 - We do not know when student timetables will be available for students, as the PHO announcement will be made in August
- How did the Grade 12 FRIM students do on their DELF exams? Will the International Language Certificate be included at the commencement ceremony?
 - All Grade 12 FRIM students taking the DELF passed their exams
 - Congratulatory announcement of achievement was in the newsletter
 - Certificates of language credential comes from France, and will not be ready in time for commencement, therefore they will be mailed to families directly
- When will yearbooks be handed out to students?
 - Not sure right now. Yearbooks are being printed right now.
