## PARENT ADVISORY COUNCIL MEETING AGENDA April 12<sup>th</sup>, 2021

\*\*Call to order at 7:02pm\*\*

- Motion made to pass the minutes from the February 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2021 PAC Meeting

# 1. Administration report

- a) We discovered that the Grade 8's didn't fully understand the significance of the welcome pole and what it represented. We now do a Land Acknowledgement will be held moving forward with the singing of both the English and French national anthems. We're the first school in district to create land acknowledgement, and it's included in WolfTV. Students are now more aware about the Indigenous culture.
- b) COVID safety guidelines, are coming in from the district based on how many exposures have been generated at a school, as part of a tiered approach. Schools will remain open and not go virtual. There will be no shutdown. Salish staff received their vaccine (last). There are new safety guidelines – universal, intensive and targeted. Salish under universal rules of 100% masks must be worn, no food/drink, adults cannot meet more than 10mins. All staff have now had the vaccine, Salish was the last school to be completed.
- c) There is 3 early dismissals before the end of the year to review new COVID protocols
- d) Expecting a quartered semester system again next year (2021/22), for at minimum the first half of the year. A block with be face to face, B block is blended.
- e) Start time will be 8:15, ending at 2:35 to stagger traffic congestion in the neighbourhood.
- f) All grades will have classes of the same length

# **Questions for Administration:**

- What happened with the planned spring break parking lot maintenance? I didn't notice anything different.
  - Landscaping company came in and removed 9 beds of shrubbery, directional arrows are the wrong colour and too small, still need better signage. Parking lot stall lines are nearly unrecognizable in less than 3 years. A letter from parents is needed to help with ongoing safety concerns. Parents are encouraged to send letters of parking lot safety concerns to Mme. Hammond at the school.
  - A consultant was brought in during the busiest part of the day to observe the parking lot insanity last year and was supposed to provide a report regarding suggestions for safety improvements and ease of traffic flow, but report has never been forwarded to the school. We want to see the consultant's report from last year.
- Are you able to provide an update regarding the follow-up from the district regarding the upcoming graduation commencement ceremony?
  - Tuesday, June 22<sup>nd</sup> will be ceremony day (between LTSS and CHSS commencement dates)
  - Date does not conflict with other schools.
  - Event will be outside near the rolling doors, the stage has been ordered, and lighting and black curtains etc (owned by the school) will be utilized (provided by previous PAC funding requests)
  - Video streaming and ceremony video will be made available (\$8,000); grad fees may be applied although there is pressure from the district not to charge any fees until plans can be finalized due to possible changes in COVID restrictions. Plan B would be to have a grad in September, or a 100% virtual grad. Grad Fee for 2019-2020 was only \$45 which did not cover enough of the supplies for commencement.
  - Still working on logistics of how to move students across the stage and determine if parents can attend, will be determined based on the PHO at that time. Grads will not be able to see friends cross the stage
  - Blankets/cards to be presented to each graduate as they cross the stage
  - Grads need to complete their grad write-ups in May because starting June 1<sup>st</sup> all grad comments will be read daily over the PA at the school so that they can be shared with the students

- Commencement speeches will commence on the 18<sup>th</sup> at the school, over the PA system, so that the speeches can be shared with the students at the school
- What is the back up plan for Grad if the government decides to shut everything down again?
  - If that happens, we will look at a September Grad
- If the district has asked the school not to charge a Grade Fee, then what will happen, with the district cover the costs?
  - The district has asked the school not to charge fees YET, this is only coming up because the school is asking for an increase in fees and that is what the district wants to hold off on. Last year's fee was \$45
