Online and blended learning will be continuing. Teachers are available to students. There is
a 15 min blended time each morning, lunch and afterschool where teachers are available to
help students. If students are having trouble connecting to teachers, parents try and reach
out to teacher and if that still doesn't work, let administration know. Feedback is important
as we are a learning as well. Many students are not logging on. Connect with your teacher
have conversations and zoom calls.

Q- Concerned about students having an academic class, such as math, during a Q1 and not for the rest of the year or end of next year?

• That's the downfall of the quarter system. We have those concerns as well. We are always finding and talking about ways to make this system better for everyone.

Q- The anxiety that some students are feeling is overwhelming how can we help them make it through the year?

• Connect with your councillor and teachers, everyone wants success through this. Do what is best for your student. Work at what pace the student is comfortable with.

Q- Why can't school sports resume if students are playing community sports now within cohorts like a 4 team grouping?

• It's the mixing of the schools. Going from outside to inside makes a cleaning schedule issue. We are starting sports according to the guidelines for schools.
