The programs in this school give vulnerable and at risk youth, often with mental health concerns, an opportunity to fill their learning gaps and gain much needed life skills: with the goal of employment or post-secondary after graduation.

Adolescent Day Treatment Program (ADTP):

ADTP is a provincial resource program operated in partnership with Fraser Health. Students with mental health issues are referred by Child and Youth Mental Health clinicians or by a psychiatrist.

Child Day Treatment Outreach Program (CDTOP)

Location: WF Davidson

CDTOP serves elementary school aged students who have a diagnosis of anxiety, psychosis and or mood disorder (replace with; diagnosis of anxiety and other comorbid disorders.) who are living in the Surrey/White Rock area. Either the school or clinician can initiate the referral process. Students are in the program for one year, with intake happening from September to the end of April.

This program is for students who have low academic ability due to missed schooling/ have a K (Mild Intellectual Disability) and H (Intensive Behaviour/ Serious Mental Illness) designation that require a more specialized learning environment than what is provided in a regular secondary school.

They are residential treatment programs for youth who have current court orders directing them to attend a treatment program and school. The students are referred by probation officers and are from all parts of BC. They also accept private fee-for-service referrals.

The Compass (Pre-Employment) Program, for Interagency students *only*, will give students a variety of skills to help them obtain and maintain employment. If they can focus for 2-3 hours per day, have a genuine interest in working, are in Grade 12 or their over age year, and don't have any reason that would prohibit them from working, then the student is a good candidate for this program. This program is to enhance the student transitioning to adulthood.
