Claudine Davies- School Principal's Report - January Update - What's Happening at EMS:

January News - COVID Update

- Managed Christmas COVID impact difficult situation for students, families and staff
- Reviewed all risk exposures and revised all PE protocols/guidelines and implemented increased mitigation and control measures.
- PE guidelines were also reviewed by District and released today key points/measures include;
 - Masks can and should be worn in all activities including PE
 - Increased cleaning of all shared equipment throughout the day
 - Limitation of high cardio activities particularly non distanced
 - No invasive games
- New system of reporting exposures at school
 - Fraser Health (FH) have changed communications, how they inform schools
 - o FH will no longer release a school bulletin at the end of an exposure
 - Self-monitoring and self-isolation letters will first be reviewed by school principal
 This is an improved process as the school is more informed of the students contact and
 movement

Course Planning - September

- Current estimate of total students enrolled for September, 2020 = 1400 Students, a 25% decrease from current enrolment
 - Estimate 200 Grade 8's which is a significant decrease from prior years (from 400)
- All cross boundary applications will be reviewed by all south end schools prior to spring break
- First virtual parent info night held for grade 8 students 140 parents attended
- Currently planning for a Quarterly/Learning cohort system for September
 - This can be easily flipped to a semester system should the opportunity arise
 - With more planning time there should be an improved course match in cohorts and balancing as well as allowing for specialty programs (Inquiry, Accelerated math).
 - The hope is to increase face to face teaching time for Grade 10-12 and return to a typical schedule quickly.



Quarter 2 Ending

- Q2 ends this Friday January, 29th
- Two completion days Thursday & Friday to finish projects/assignments
- Report cards available on MyEd, Friday, February 5th
- Grade 10 are completing their Literacy Assessment this week
- Mr. Ratslaff is moving to Richmond School District to become Principal
- We will welcome Ms. Farquhar from Kwantlen Park Secondary as our new Vice Principal.
 Kirsten Farquhar has extensive experience in the district and initially completed her student teaching at EMS.

Questions for Claudine Davies after Principal's Report

Question: A participant inquired on the Fraser health changes –particularly, what is it that you do differently (other than student, teacher privacy)? Specifically raising the issue that the time lag was too long and therefore likely resulting in more COVID contacts.

Answer: Claudine gets a security code to check on a particular student who has tested positive to ensure the right communication is sent out. Claudine noted that it is very helpful if a parent phones and tells them they have tested and allows the school to speak to the teachers. This allows for a much quicker communication to inform parents which allows everyone the ability to decide what they want to do which in turn equates to timely and better decisions.

Question: Have there been any notable impacts on student performance and/or engagement due to the quarterly structure 3 hours per course?

Answer: Overall kids seem to be doing well. The teachers have noted that they are not able to cover as much material in the afternoon classes versus am due to attention spans. However, they have also noted fewer behavioural issues which could be part of the more structured program (only 2 places to be and same cohort).

Question: A question was posed related to the FH letter and the media's message, clarification on was it 50 cases or 50 kids? In addition the letter sent on January 11th seemed to indicate that a lot of kids did not return, was January attendance way down and has it bounced back?

Answer: Claudine confirmed it was 50 students/staff in the school. 50 people have however not come forward. The letter was alarming, and confusing for all including staff. Prior to Jordan Tinney's letter, Claudine met with staff to ensure it was handled carefully. The first week was focused on compassion and understanding. Everyone needs to decide what they can and cannot do and the school is there to support them (1st week approximately 30% did not attend). Week #2 was focused on encouraging to come back (approximately 10% did not attend), and the 3rd week they saw that pretty much all were back, very few that did not come back at all. It certainly was an unsettling event;



Claudine has spoken to colleagues around the district who have had more cases but not all at once as EMS did.

Question: Question related to how can the PAC help get the message out to parents that their involvement in communicating directly with the school can make a difference – suggestion that something be stated in the newsletter.

Answer: Claudine stated it would be a good idea to include some communication in the EMS Newsletter and will action.

Question: How does the school manage the distancing during lunch hour?

Answer: It is difficult but students are wearing masks outside. The most risky time is in the first 10-15 minutes when they meet up with friends then they tend to spread out. If students stay inside they must remain in their am cohort class. There are also regular PA announcements reminding students of expected behaviour. Fraser Health states the safest is in their academic class at desk facing one way wearing a mask.

Question: Question was posed about current bullying activity (face to face and online) seem to hear less, are you seeing less?

Answer: In general fewer behaviour referrals this year, not sure perhaps due to the more structured environment and less interaction will all kids. Social media is still a concern and the social media presentation will be held in Q3, it is still an ongoing concern. It does not mean less is going on it could be more subtle or they are just hearing less of it.

Action: Claudine will remind/encourage teachers to fulfill their funding requests.

Re Gaming Funds: We have 3 years to spend the gaming funds so we are fine, we should perhaps consider higher funding amounts next year, recommend that teachers put forward full requirements to be considered.

CPF Report –presented by Tamsin Lehn

- CPF had a short meeting on Jan 14; discussed 2 main topics:
- \$200 per school is available from CPF to fund a French cultural event during the month of February. Limited opportunities this year in what can be done but encourage all schools French departments to think about what they can do for the students. They can submit details of that event or item to CPF and it can be reimbursed.
