<u>Ms. Claudine Davies- School Principal's Report</u> - <u>May Activity – What's Happening at</u> <u>EMS:</u>

# 1. Graduation/Commencements

- Commencement Ceremony went off without issue, and NO RAIN! The ceremony was livestreamed for parents and families.
- In addition, it was recorded and will be sent out to families when edited.
- The students walked through a path of affirmative messages, walked across the stage as their comments were read out, a professional photo was taken (which will also be given out before the end of June), a selfie station built by Peace Portal volunteers was an additional photo opportunity, including tossing their hat on an outside stage (which will be part of a compilation at the end of the video, and finally walking out to the parking lot on a red carpet.
- Over \$71,000 were given in Community and District scholarships to our grads that evening.

# 2. Spring Activities

- Our spring sports are nearing completion, two weeks of spring football training is planned prior to the end of June.
- Student Council is looking to find ways to end the year on a high note for students with an ice cream day. We are waiting on permissions from District Health and Safety.
- Recognition of Kamloops Residential School discovery:
  - The school is currently flying its flag at half-mast in recognition. We are asking all staff and students to wear orange in support and to honor the survivors of this tragic part of our history. The following statement has gone out to all staff and students:

Earl Marriott Secondary is encouraging students and staff to wear an orange shirt at any point this week in honour and remembrance of the 215 children who lost their lives at the Residential School in Kamloops. Wearing an orange shirt is one way to honour the survivors of residential schools and those that did not return. We hope that wearing orange this week is an opportunity to create meaningful discussion about the effects of residential schools and the legacy they have left behind.

 In addition, our school will be working together with our Aboriginal department to continue to find ways to support and educate our students through our curriculum and our actions.

# **3.** COVID Update/September Update:

- Although we are very optimistic about a full reopening in September, with the continuation of the current COVID numbers, schools as an institution were notably missed from any announcement of future planning. We are waiting for an announcement from our PHO and Minister of Education.
- At this time, we are no longer planning for cohorts for Grade 8 and 9; however, we currently have built our timetable for the Quarter system. It would require no modification to move the timetable to a semester system, if an announcement were made.
- We also anticipate full face-to-face classes for all Grades. There has been limited expression of interest for the Blended online program for Grade 8 and 9 (>10), so likely we will help these students register through SAIL COMPASS program.
- We are also very excited with the announcement of Vaccinations being available to children ages 12-18, and what that could mean for an unrestricted school year for 2021-22. We are encouraging our students to participate in this opportunity as they see fit.
- Next year, we look forward to fewer portables, bringing all of our teachers and students back indoors, and hopefully opening lockers and the cafeteria (although we did love our indoor hockey rink!).

# 4. Year End

- Our school year will end with a final Provincial Assessment the week of 21st-24th.
- Final Report cards will be published on Thursday, June 24th.
- The school will remain open as it is a summer school site

#### **Questions for Claudine Davies after Principal's Report**

**Question**: Will school be able to offer the traditional incoming Grade 8 scavenger hunt? **Answer**: No not at this time but will look at possible Grade 8 activities in September.

**Question:** Have the social media initiatives abated the situation and will there be followed up programs?

**Answer:** Ms. Davies feels that this will be an ongoing issue that will need to be addressed annually. Recently there was another situation in the grade 8 classes that underlines that this seems to be an ongoing concern.

Additional Comments: A discussion/recommendation was made to look towards creating events and informative sessions to include all feeder schools both elementary and high schools. That the school community should work together and offer more sessions to achieve a further reach and address before kids reach high school.

**Question:** Year book distribution in September – given that there will be students leaving to Grandview Heights will there be an opportunity for students to visit school to allow them to have yearbooks signed by fellow students?

**Answer:** Ms. Davies will have to revisit how this could be initiated depending on the rules in September.

A Canada Learning Bond Navigator can explain what RESPs are and the different grants available, and can also help with overcoming common barriers such as ID, social insurance numbers, taxes, etc."

Over the past month, CPF has been working on two items of note to secondary schools:

- Annual CPF Awards have been decided 10 students were chosen from many well-written and deserving applicants. There were two students chosen at EMS – one in French Immersion and one in Core French. As the students' names were not published in the program due to the tight turnaround in the judging process and the timing of EMS commencement ceremony, CPF will not disclose the names until they have been notified properly. Each student received \$500 from CPF-Surrey, who will provide a cheque once contact has been made with the students.
- CPF-Surrey extends a thank you to teachers of French Immersion, Core French and Intensive French throughout the district. CPF will be planning recognition in the fall.
- Annual CPF awards have now been awarded, communication with students is forthcoming. 2 EMS students were beneficiaries
