### **7:08 PM – 7:50 PM - Mr. Graham Magnusson- School Vice-Principal's Report**

1463 Students registered in Fall 2024

110 International students

79 Teaching staff

16 IES inclusive education support workers

School message last year to all students – “Kindness” was central core value. What we do, look through eyes of kindness.

This school year and additional layer – “Service to Others”. Helping others and service to community. “What can I do to help things out?”

For example: Helping support elementary schools, possibly being a mentor.

Updates for this school year:

- 1) Crisp hallways initiative – keeping kids in the classroom. For example, hall passes. Trying to keep kids in the classroom where the learning happens.
- 2) Refocus in terms of how students use electronics in the school - Former thinking: If you're not engaged in learning, I can go on my device. Current thinking: Assume you can't use your device. EMS teachers have different systems to keep track of device use. Electronic devices can be a good tool for learning, however can be a distraction in class. Early feedback from teachers is that there is a small shift in being engaged in learning with the shift to limiting electronic device use in the classroom.
- 3) EMS has a large athletics program that is well underway - Football started in August, boys soccer, cross country, volleyball, swimming.
- 4) School events – Grad tradition Mariners game in Seattle – successful trip, took 100 grads this year.
- 5) Grad – Grade 12 parent evening last week, quite well attended. Information regarding grad events and expectations, as well as scholarship information
- 6) Athletic - parent meeting last week, was less well attended. Mr. Magnusson will work on communication.
- 7) Grad boat cruise coming up
- 8) This Friday - Professional development day. Plan to do goal setting for EMS for the next 5 years.
- 9) If you are thinking in getting involved at EMS - we have a dry grad committee that parents can get involved with.



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## Questions & Answers:

Q: Can we have phone free days? Some teachers have pockets that the student puts the phone into, can all teachers have this? Can we use PAC funds for hotels to supply to the teachers?

A: ¾ of the classrooms have some sort of cabinet or 'phone hotel'. There is a risk that something could go missing.

Q: I thought cell phones were banned in schools?

A: No, the government transferred responsibility to the Ministry of Education. SD36 says that phones can be used for education purposes otherwise it is expected to be put away. Generally, at EMS, if a student doesn't put the phone away when the teacher asks, it may be put into the office and would be returned to the parent. A recommended book about teens, phones and social media: The Anxious Generation by Johnathon Heidt.

Q: Can the teachers provide input into how many classes need phones?

A: Yes, there is some information on this which can be provided. 36% of staff don't engage in electronic devices. 64% use electronic devices, of which 67% use it weekly. Teachers would like strict controls on phones, but would still like students to have them.

Q: How is EMS in line with other SD36 with electronic device use.

A: We are similar to other schools. Our staff is committed to working with parents. Booked Jesse Miller for parent education. EMS hopes to get more information from students on their use of phones in the school.

Q: Gym lockers, kids need to bring a lock for the gym locker. Items are being stolen and not being reported.

A: This is the first that Mr Magnusson has heard of it. He will post it on the grade teams
