# **Questions for Claudine Davies after Principal's Report**

**Question**: Are some classes operating over capacity and why is there a shortage of desks in some classes?

**Answer**: Classes have a maximum capacity of 30 students, many are at capacity but none are over. With respect to any missing desk Vice Principal Haffner will look into this immediately there should be no shortage of desks.

**Question:** What actions are being done to address the Tik Tok Challenge on stealing from school property?

**Answer:** EMS has had some vandalism – removal of soap dispensers in some washrooms and the Girls wash room being decorated, leaving a large mess.

Action taken: Announcements have been made at how damaging this is and expensive. All costs are taken from the school budget which means less activity budget for the year. Anyone caught will face consequences both monetary impact and disciplinary action. This has been a very unfortunate act however with over 1400 students and 3 events most students are seen as responsible. Safe Schools reviews TikTok videos to look for damage to Surrey Schools.

**Question:** Clarification was asked on the difference between Discovery Rotation versus ADST. **Answer:** Discovery program includes; Arts, Drama, Info-Tech & Careers 8; **ADST –** Applied Design, Skills and Technology includes: Home Economics – Food & Sewing and Metal & Woodwork. Students that are in the band program do not participate in Discovery.

**Question:** What is the current monitoring of the drop off zone loop and is there any crosswalk supervision this year?

**Answer:** AM supervision is carried out by one person and the PM supervision is handled by 2 people. There currently has been no crosswalk monitor due to COVID, the hiring back of such positions has posed to be challenging as well as the hiring of cafeteria staff.

**Question:** With fewer kids in the school why are students not allowed to sit in hallways during lunch?

**Answer:** Classes have been opened up to accommodate kids during lunch as hallways are meant to be kept clear for safety reasons.

- June 10<sup>th</sup> \$6,971.98 payment for Grad Blankets to Big Coast Brands
- June 10<sup>th</sup> \$2,703.94 payment for Grad Plant Fundraiser to Pamela Wilson
- August 5<sup>th</sup> \$570 received from Surrey School District for donations from parents for grad gifts

#### Items to note for the Dry Grad Account:

- 1. \$1,000 currently in Dry Grad Account must be used for 2021-2022 Ulysses Scholarship Award which must be replaced by current Dry Grad Class.
- 2. \$5,269.22 deposit is being held by Vancouver Partyworks Interactive for use by current Dry Grad Class but funds must be left in Dry Grad Account in lieu
- 3. \$300.00 deposit is being held by Rick Mearns Magician for use by current Dry Grad Class but funds must be left in Dry Grad Account in lieu
- 4. \$283.34 deposit is being held by DJ Services DJ for use by current Dry Grad Class but funds must be left in Dry Grad Account in lieu

Therefore, remaining balance in Dry Grad Account as of June 30, 2022 must be at least \$7,003.24 for the following years Dry Grad Class.

#### • Other Treasurer activities:

- Grant Summary was completed and filed with BC Gaming Grant Office to ensure funds are received for this current school year.
- BC Gaming Funds are expected towards the end of October 2021 based on previous years student enrolment numbers (approx. \$20.00 per student enrolled) expecting approx. \$37,760.00.
- Things to consider :
  - 1. For the students who moved over to Grandview Heights will gaming funds be approved to move over with them
  - 2. Last year approx. 50% gaming funds were preserved to help with future gaming fund requests must be used 36 months from the date they were received.
  - 3. We can continue to save gaming funds based on request on an ongoing rolling basis (say approx.. \$15,000)
  - 4. This will still give us approx. 40,000 in gaming funds for requests received this year from EMS clubs/teachers/programs/etc.
