#### Immunizations are coming for students in Grade 9 and 10



Public Health Nurses will be at Earl Marriott Secondary school to provide immunizations on:

#### Nov/27/2025

If you haven't provided consent yet, you can consent for immunizations online at, immunizationconsent.gov.bc.ca/s/ or you can fill out the paper consent form and return it to the school by Nov/07/2025.

#### How do I know if the child is up to date on vaccines?

Check your child's immunization record by going to immunizationconsent.gov.bc.ca/s/ and reviewing their Immunization history to see what they have had and "Immunizations Forecasted" to see what they need.

#### What if the child had vaccines but they are not on their immunization record?

If the child's record is missing vaccines they have already had, please do the following:

- 1. Find the paper record at home, if you were given one at the time of vaccination.
- 2. If you do not have records at home, contact the health care provider who gave the vaccines and ask for a copy of the immunization record.
- 3. Provide a copy of the immunization record you have to your local Public Health Unit or bring a copy to the upcoming school immunization clinic.
- 4. Report these immunizations online by either scanning this QR code or by going to FraserHealth.ca/immunizationform.
