If you are waiting for your student, please go into the parking lot and wait in a designated spot. Please remember to keep the handicap/disabled spots open unless you have a permit.

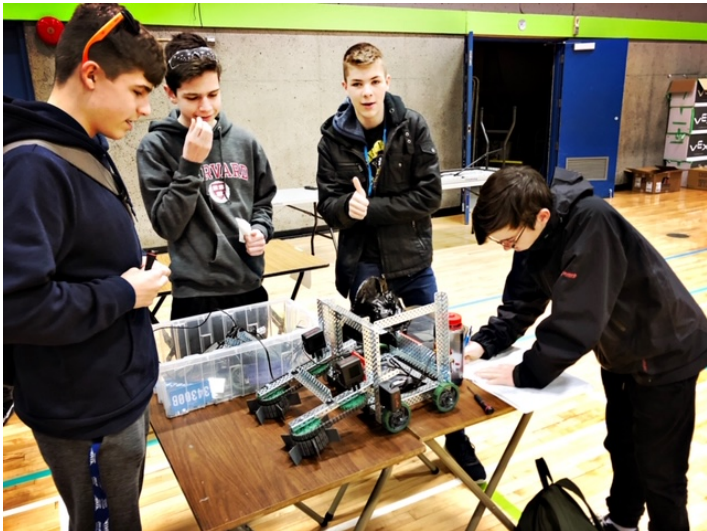
DISNEYLAND DANCE TRIP


