PARENT CORDER

For the safety of our students, staff and visitors, we need all drivers to adhere to the parking lot and drop off safety rules listed below:

- No parking, stopping, waiting, etc. in the marked yellow area/lane in front of the school (busses and emergency vehicles only). This marked area is not an additional lane for parents to use. Please keep this area free at all times.
- Students to be picked up and dropped off in the parking lot
- Proceed with caution while in the parking lot, as pedestrians are present

For student drop off and pick up:

- - Turn into the driveway located at the south of Salish Secondary
- - Turn left onto school property, and make an immediate left turn into the parking lot where students are to be dropped off and picked up
- - Exit at the lights onto 184th Street

To enter and exit parking lot:

- - Enter parking lot: follow the same path as above
- - Exit parking lot: use the exit at the North end of the lot

Student drop off and pick up is in the parking lot.

If we continue to see unsafe driving, we will need to take drastic measures that would significantly restrict access to our parking lot and drop off areas.

Some things we have witnessed are:

Speeding through the parking lot, speeding in the pick up and drop off area, parking in the bus lane, going the wrong way when entering from the light, not stopping for pedestrians


