Graduation Requirements

BC Diploma Verification Report

- All Grade 12 students should receive in January 2025 their BC Diploma Verification Report.
- This document reviews all of the courses taken during the graduation program (grades 10-12) and your child's Graduation status.
- If you are concerned about whether or not your child will be graduating, please contact your child's counsellor.
- Students who are not in a position to graduate this year will not be able to participate in the graduation celebrations.

What is Career Life Connections 12?

CLC 12 - Post Secondary Exploration

- Students use MyBlueprint to explore and evaluate different Post Secondary Schools and Programs in relation to their skills and areas of interest.
- Students use MyBlueprint to examine different post-secondary programs based on their pathway eligibility which is tied to their High-School coursework.
- Students present researched overviews and watch presentations on a variety of Canadian Universities.
- Students use a decision-making model to analyze both post-secondary and career-based options.
- Students use a "backwards-planning" model to tie careers to their related post-secondary programs.
- KPU guest speaker in all CLC classes which covers:
 - How to apply, financial aid, different programs, intake limits etc.
- Education Planner presentation to all CLC classes which covers:
 - Post-secondary costs, financial aid options, student services, how to create an_account, save programs, paths, and careers to My List, and apply to post-secondary in B.C.

Post-Secondary Information and Applications



Fleetwood Park Secondary hosts several online Post Secondary Institutes Information sessions throughout the school year. Entrance requirements, application processes and general information about each school is reviewed. Please see the **Career Education Department** for details. Students planning to attend a college or university will need to provide their transcript information to those institutions.



Student Transcripts Service (STS)

The Ministry of Education has just launched the Student Transcripts Service (STS), a new online application for students to view their marks, scholarships and transcripts, and send transcripts to post-secondary institutions and third parties. To access the service, visit the Ministry of Education's Order Transcripts and Certificates website at www.StudentTranscripts.gov.bc.ca and follow the instructions found there.

Post Secondary Institution Choices Form (PSI)

Students planning to attend a college or university will need to provide their Transcript information to those institutions. You are able to provide that information electronically to a number of post-secondary institutions by completing an electronic Post Secondary Institutions Selections form online. This is available from January to June of each school year via the Student Secure Page on the Ministry web site at: PSI Link: www.bced.gov.bc.ca/exams/tsw/tsw/student/







Scholarships

Graduating students are encouraged to apply for scholarships. Complete and detailed scholarship information can be found on The Grade 12 TEAMS Scholarship Channel.

Organize and submit your documents well in advance.

For letters of reference or recommendation, choose people who know you well and can describe your achievements. Contact them well in advance, and please note deadlines carefully. Please contact Ms. Brar-Sidhu @ brar_d@surreyschools.ca if you have any questions and let her know if you win a scholarship so you can be recognized at the Commencement Ceremony.

"The Big Show" of Caps and Gowns at the Bell Theatre Tuesday June 3rd




2 Guest Tickets Guaranteed per Graduate

Community Safety Letter





Royal Canadian Gendarmerie royale Mounted Police du Canada

October 5, 2022

Dear Parents and Guardians:

As we settle into this new school year, the Surrey School District and the Surrey RCMP want to reaffirm our shared commitment to student safety and wellbeing. Both of our organizations are committed to supporting students and their families, and ensuring that every student has a safe, fun and productive school year.

We would also like to take this opportunity to remind parents and guardians that safety is a shared responsibility. We encourage you to talk to your child about safety and their responsibilities at home, at school and in the community. Unsafe or illegal activities have no place on or off school grounds. This includes:

- Bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, threat(s) or intimidation
- Unsafe or dangerous activities
- Violence or discrimination of any form
- Verbal, physical or sexual harassment or abuse
- Theft or vandalism
- Possession or use of intoxicating or banned substances
- Possession or use of weapons (or replica weapons like air soft or BB guns) and explosives

We know that these conversations can be difficult, but they are critical. Please reach out to your school if you need any support. We have also compiled some additional resources that you may find helpful:

- <u>PSST (Protecting Surrey Schools Together)</u>: PSST (psst-bc.ca) is a district resource where school safety concerns
 can be reported confidentially by anyone in our school communities.
- There are a number of youth programs and initiatives to facilitate positive connections between youth, their family, school and the community, including <u>Code Blue/Mini Blue</u>, <u>Project Lavender</u>, <u>Shattering the Image</u> and the <u>Wrap Program</u>.
- The <u>Surrey RCMP Parent Helpline</u> (604-599-7800) provides guidance for parents and guardians who believe their child is involved or at risk of becoming involved in criminal activity.
- The Surrey RCMP <u>Family & Youth Resource Support Team</u> (FYRST) works with youth when they first start to
 exhibit signs of poor decision-making and need to find attachment to other resources and supports.

We hope you find these resources helpful, and we encourage you to reach out to your school, the district's Safe Schools department or any of the resources above if you need any support or more information.
