- Minimum 1 number
- Minimum 1 special symbol/character: # or \$ or ! or @
- · Your password cannot contain: first name, middle name, last name, date of birth, personal id or sequential letters or numbers



Dear Parents and Guardians/Caregivers,

The Student Learning Survey (SLS) has been administered every year in B.C. public schools since 2001. Prior to 2016-17 it was known as the Student Satisfaction Survey. The SLS provides feedback on the implementation of the curriculum changes, learning environment, student wellness and satisfaction, student belonging and engagement, and career preparation. The SLS is the only source of province-wide information about students' learning experiences through the perspectives of students, parents, guardians/caregivers, and school staff. Schools and districts use the SLS to make informed decisions around long-term planning and goal-setting, and in providing individual students personalized support.

The parent and guardian/caregiver survey is now available online and is available in 18 different languages. The survey will be available until Friday, May 2nd, and will take approximately 30 minutes to complete. Your responses are voluntary and anonymous, and your child will not be identified as a result of your participation in the survey. Any personal or identifying information will be deleted before results are stored. Data will be stored and accessible only within Canada.

To complete the survey:

- Go to any computer that has an up-to-date internet browser access at home, work, or school.
- Go to www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat_survey/access.htm
- Click on the Parents icon for Direct (logon-free) Access
- District: the name of your child's district
- School: the name of your child's school
- Language: the language of your choice
- Complete the survey by clicking on the appropriate circle to answer each question and click "NEXT".
- When you are finished the survey, you will get a message "Thank you for sharing your views".
- Once complete, your school will have the results immediately.

The surveys contain standard questions for the Province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included.

Any computer or mobile device with an Internet Connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure.




The Surrey School District is Committed to Truth & Reconciliation

Surrey Schools fulfills its vision for learning on the traditional, ancestral, and unceded territory of the Katzie, Kwantlen, Semiahmoo and other Coast Salish digenous peoples who are its Peoples. Our role as a school district on unceded territory means edging whose land we are on, that in all of our actions, we must foreground our commitment to reconciliation with Indigenous peoples. True reconciliation and respect for Indigenous peoples means going beyond equity and inclusion and instead acknowledging the history and legacies of colonialism and taking stock of the ways individual and collective actions in our schools work to continue those trends or reverse them. Canada's actions in establishing, continuing, and defending the residential school system caused serious harm to Indigenous people. As British Columbia commits to fully implementing the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, our district reaffirms its commitments to both truth reconciliation as a means to address any systemic discrimination or inequities.

In Surrey, these commitments mean consistently acknowledging the land we are on, and paying the due respect to those Inoriginal inhabitants. By acknowlwe not only give proper recognition to Indigenous peoples, but we enter into a framework for dialogue

and growth in the relationship between Indigenous peoples and settlers, which emphasizes Indigenous peoples' rights to self-determination. The right to self-determination means that Indigenous students have a

right to see their histories taught accurately to all students. It means that Indigenous students have a right to have their experiences and practices reflected in the school curriculum. It means that they have a right to social, cultural, and emotional support systems. It means that schools must equip all students with the tools for "intercultural understanding, empathy and respect," and all teachers with the training they need to accomplish that goal. Now and in the future, the district affirms our commitment to truth and reconciliation across our vision for learning.
