### Lunar New Year Parade



This year, Fraser Wood will be celebrating Lunar New Year on Friday February 16 at 1:45 pm until the end of the school day.

A huge thank you to Ms. Chung and Mr. Weakes for organizing our Lunar New Year event this year! This year, leadership students have been learning to create crafts in which they will be going into classes to help all students build - all in preparation for our parade this school year.

We are excited to invite all parents / guardians and family members to our Lunar New Year Parade this school year. Classes will be lead by students in Ms. Chung's class and will include a traditional cloth dragon to lead the parade. We will have our gym open with seating available for families to watch - all classes will be coming through the gym. Like our Halloween parade, if the weather is nice, parents are also welcome to watch from outside and around the school if you prefer.

Years of the Dragon include 2036, 2024, 2012, 2000, 1988, 1976, 1964, 1952... People born in Dragon years usually possess natural courage, tenacity, and intelligence, often displaying enthusiasm and confidence.

2024 is the Year of the Wood Dragon, beginning on February 10th, 2024 (Chinese New Year) and concluding on January 28th, 2025 (Chinese New Year's Eve).



Pink Shirt Day - February 28th, 2024

February 28, 2024 marks Pink Shirt Day this school year. Fraser Wood will recognize this day with an assembly alongside work and conversations in classes. Thank you to Mr. Barry, Mr. Calbick and our leadership team for all the work that will go into preparing for this year's day - the theme this year is Lift Each Other Up! Students are encouraged to wear pink this 28th!

#### History of Pink Shirt Day:

The global movement of Pink Shirt Day traces back to 2007 in Berwick Nova Scotia, a small town with a population of 2,500.

After a new student at their school was bullied for wearing a pink shirt, two Grade 12 students — David Shepherd and Travis Price — bought 50 pink shirts and encouraged their classmates to wear pink.

The next day they went to distribute the shirts and to their surprise the majority of students arrived wearing pink. With that act of kindness, Pink Shirt Day was born. It has since become a global movement.

In recognition of the Berwick event, Nova Scotia proclaimed the second Thursday of September "Stand Up Against Bullying Day."

In 2008, B.C. proclaimed Feb. 27 to be the provincial anti-bullying day, and the movement has continued to grow.

In 2012, the United Nations declared May 4 as Anti-Bullying Day, and now the last Wednesday each February is Canada's national Pink Shirt/anti-bullying day.

### Staff Parking Lot / Student Pick-Up & Drop-Off
