National Day for Truth and Reconciliation



Fraser Wood Elementary observed the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and <u>Orange Shirt</u> <u>Day</u> took place on September 29, 2023.

Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day that honours the children who survived residential schools and remembers those who did not. This day relates to the experience of Phyllis Webstad, a Northern Secwepemc (Shuswap) from the Stswecem'c Xgat'tem First Nation, on her first day of school, where she arrived dressed in a new orange shirt, which was taken from her. It is now a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations.

On Friday September 29, students and staff wore orange while taking the opportunity to listen to the truths being shared by Canada's Indigenous communities. We encourage everyone to reflect on the opportunities we each have to be an ally and to walk the path of reconciliation.

As part of our school's work towards Truth and Reconciliation and in line with the First People's Principles of Learning, grade 4 students planted trees while every division made a class shirt with every student's handprints attached. Every Child Matters and nature and community matter at Fraser Wood. Everyone can be part of the reconciliation process.

Allergy Awareness



A friendly reminder to all of our families that we are a nut aware and scent aware school as a number of our students and staff have life-threatening allergies. Exposure to nut products and scented products may cause serious harm. Please help keep our school community safe by ensuring your child's lunch and snacks are nut-free and your family is avoiding the use of heavily scented products.

Student Accident Insurance



Ensure you're insured for student accidents this school year.

Accidents happen, but not everything is covered by the Medical Services Plan (MSP).

The Surrey School District does not insure expenses for student injuries that happen on school grounds or during school activities, and MSP limits the amounts paid or does not cover some charges.

Parents have the option to purchase student accident insurance for injury-related costs not covered or limited under MSP or group insurance plans. These costs may include:

* Dental treatment

- * Eyewear
- * Rental of crutches or wheelchairs
- * Splints and casts
- * Physiotherapy
- * Ambulance transportation
- * Private tutoring and counselling

Surrey Schools has made available information on student accident insurance through Insure My kids and Study Insured Student Accident. This coverage is available for purchase online, families can voluntarily purchase accident insurance through the "Insure my Kids" and "Study Insured Student Accident" programs.

Yearly plans cost between \$17 (Silver/lite), \$25 (Gold/Plus) and \$33 (Platinum/Premium), providing a full year of coverage 24 hours a day, whether at school or at home. A discounted premium is may be available for families with three or more children.

Staff Parking Lot / Student Pick-Up & Drop-Off



Just a reminder to parents and guardians that our school parking lot is for staff only. Parents dropping off or picking up students are welcome to park down the street and use the crosswalk, or use the drop off and pick up bay at the front of the school.
