Are you interested in French Immersion? If yes, please read the following:

The benefits of having a second language are well-documented. Through the Surrey School District’s Late French Immersion program, students have the unique opportunity to become functionally bilingual while continuing their intellectual and social development, gaining an appreciation for other cultures and pursuing further education and careers in either or both languages.

Late French Immersion is a full-day program starting in Grade 6 and continues through to secondary school graduation. A full 100 per cent of instruction is delivered in French during the first year, followed by 20 per cent English Language Arts in Grade 7.

Late French Immersion is an option for all students entering Grade 6 in September 2015, and parents do not need to speak either English or French to enrol their children.

Late French Immersion is offered at the following schools. Classes will be formed depending upon sufficient enrolment. Registration begins in person at the schools noted below at **8 a.m. Monday, January 26, 2015.**
