
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

Vancouver -- 10,000 students from across British Columbia competed, 264 made the provincial finals, and 6 students took home top awards in this year's pan-provincial French public speaking competition, Concours d'art oratoire.

Ultimately they become more effective as communicators, capable of inspiring others," said Diane Tijman, President of Canadian Parents for French BC & Yukon.

Julia Albert received silver with her presentation "La consommation nous consomme"


#### This Week at EMS - Principal's Message: May 29th – June 2nd :






Home of the Mariners To Strive, To Seek, To Find, and Not to Yield
