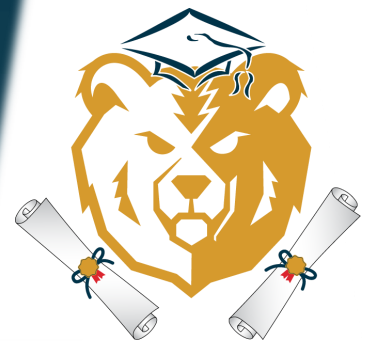

The Grandview Heights Secondary Dance Program is proud to celebrate an incredibly successful and memorable year filled with growth, achievement, and community.

We began the year with inspiring opportunities for our dancers, including our annual field trip to Harbour Dance Centre and Ballet BC, deepening their appreciation for professional dance and performance.

Our dancers continued to grow and challenge themselves throughout the competitive season. Our Dance Company proudly attended the Level Up Provincial Dance Competition at Salish Secondary, gaining valuable performance experience and representing Grandview with professionalism and pride.

This year also marked an exciting milestone for our program as we hosted the Outbreak Dance Competition for the very first time. This large-scale event welcomed over 1,000 dancers and more than 500 audience members, making it an incredible success for our school community. We are especially proud that all of our teams and classes placed in the top three in their categories at Outbreak. A standout achievement was our Advanced class receiving the prestigious Judges' Choice Award, while our Jazz Team choreographers, Colbie C. and Ryan D., earned the Top Choreography Award for the second consecutive year—an outstanding accomplishment that highlights their creativity and leadership.

We wrapped up the season with our biggest and best Year-End Dance Showcase yet, completely selling out our theatre. This performance was a true celebration of the talent, dedication, and growth of our dancers throughout the year.

We extend a heartfelt thank you to our peer tutors, our amazing coaches and choreographers, and all of our parent volunteers. A special thank you goes to the parents who supported the Outbreak Competition by working at the door and running concessions—we truly couldn't have done it without your support.

## MUSIC PROGRAM



The Grandview Heights Music Program has had a busy, fun, and successful spring! Our choir and Band 8 and 9 students travelled to Whistler at the end of April and took part in the Cantando Music Festival. Students listened to professional concerts and a variety of school groups, and they also performed and received feedback from adjudicators. All four of our participating groups (Concert Band 8, Concert Band 9, Jazz Band 8 and Jazz Band 9) received a Gold standing for their performances! As well, our Grade 9 Jazz Band was selected as the top jazz band of the festival and asked to perform at the Showcase Concert at the end of the festival!

In May, many of our Band 10 – 12 students travelled to Niagara Falls and Toronto for a five-day trip. They participated in MusicFest Canada in Niagara Falls, where they also received very positive feedback from the adjudicators. Concert Band 10, Senior Concert Band and Senior Jazz Band received a Silver standing for their performances and our Grade 10 Jazz Band received Gold! In addition, we also took in many tourist sites in Niagara Falls and Toronto including a visit to a butterfly conservatory and the falls, spending a day at Canada's Wonderland, watching the Broadway musical "& Juliet", visiting the CN Tower, and doing some shopping in downtown Toronto. It was a fantastic trip, and students and teachers had a great time!

Back home in Surrey, our grade 9 – 12 students all visited our feeder elementary schools and performed for them this spring. We wrapped up our year with a very successful Year-End Concert, featuring all nine of our music ensembles. Our Music Student Council organized our annual music mixer this past week, where students enjoyed apples, drinks, a slideshow, and the music of a professional DJ.

The music program would like to thank our students for all their work this year. We are very proud of our students' progress and had a great year with them! We would also like to congratulate our grade 12 students on their graduation! Many of these students have been involved in the music program for all of their five years at GHS, and it has been such a joy to make music with them throughout their high school years. 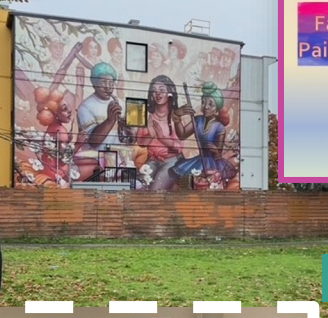

It was great to see such a positive and inclusive spirit during Pride Week. Students and staff took part in the events with enthusiasm and showed a lot of respect and support for one another.

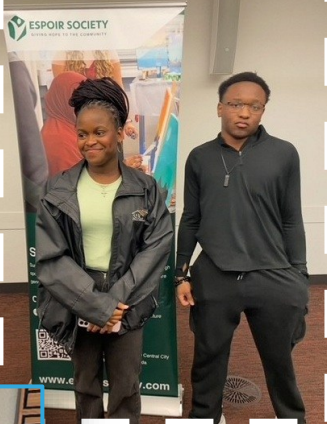

# MEDICAL ALERTS

**Parents/Guardians are responsible to update the school with any medical issues.**

A Medical Alert condition is defined as a physician diagnosed, potentially life threatening condition such as:

- Diabetes.
- Epilepsy.
- Anaphylaxis  
(history of a severe allergic response which requires planned support inside as well as outside the school environment).
- Severe Asthma  
(history of episodes requiring immediate medical treatment or a history of requiring immediate medication).
- Blood clotting disorders such as hemophilia that require immediate medical care in the event of injury.
- Serious heart conditions.
- Other conditions which may require emergency care and/or the administration of medication as determined in consultation with parents/student/family physician, school and Medical Health Officer or designate.

## PARKING / DROP-OFFS & PICK-UP INSTRUCTIONS

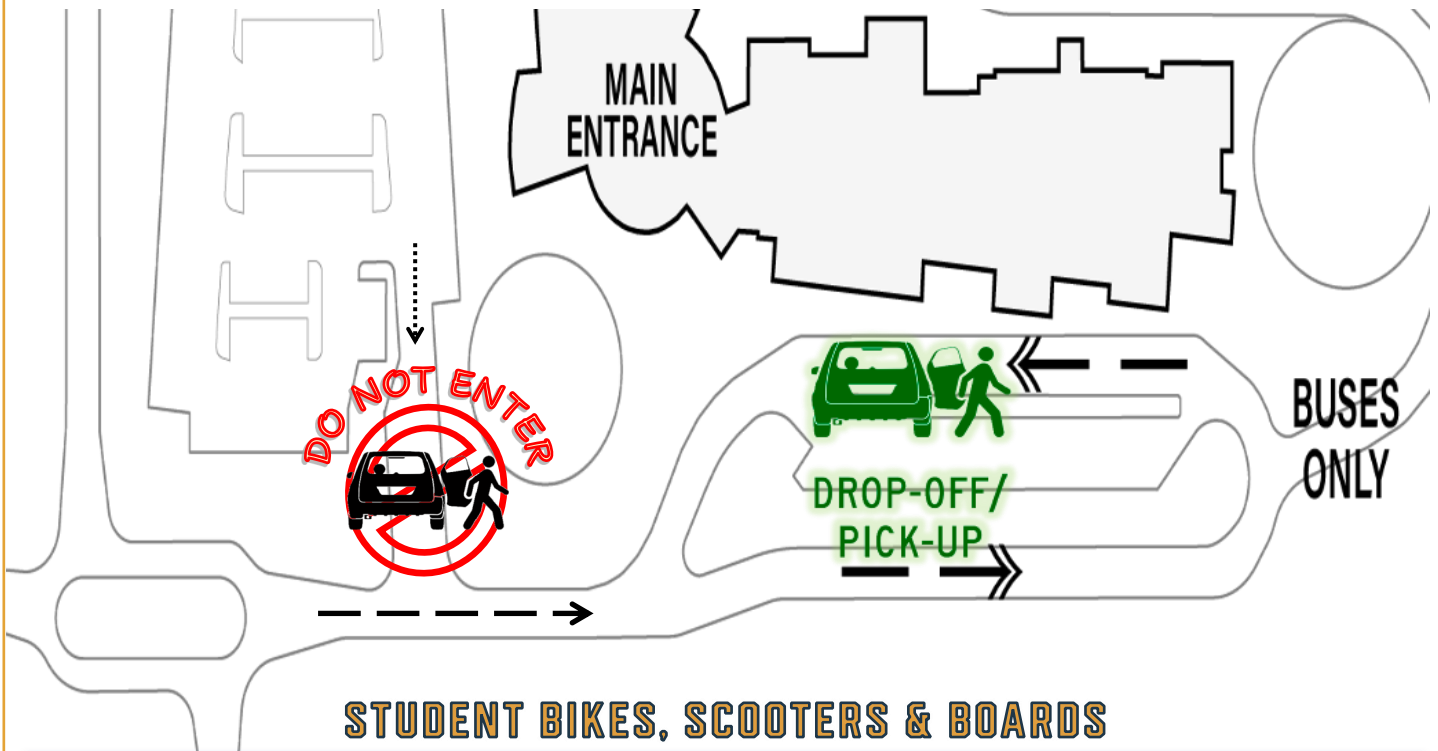
Grandview Heights Secondary Administration, staff and school PAC has worked together with the Surrey School District and City of Surrey to address some of the many traffic and safety concerns in and around our school property. I would like to thank our PACs transportation committee for their leadership and help with our work together. We have included a school traffic flow map and general updates to ensure student and staff safety remains a top priority during the morning drop off and afternoon pick up times. Please review the following information and be sure to adhere to all instructions included in this communication.

The major concerns are regarding the South-West Entrance way that runs along the West side of the Main office and in front of the Theatre. In particular, the congestion that is created when the Visitor Parking and the Accessible Parking spaces are used for the drop-off and pick-up of students is an issue that we would like to bring to everyone's attention. **We ask that vehicles do not pull into, and then out of, the Staff & Student Parking Lot or any Accessible Parking spaces for the purpose of drop-offs or pick-ups.**

**Student Drop-Off and Pick-Up.** For parents dropping off students at school, there are two laneways which run along the South side of the main classroom section of Grandview Heights. Vehicles will need to travel towards the far South-East part of the school property to enter these lanes and turn left to enter these lanes and head West through the laneways. The laneway furthest to the South has angled visitor parking spaces, while the laneway North of this is designed for vehicles to pull parallel to the curb to allow for exit and entrance to vehicles by students. **Please be aware that the doors on the East side of the building are available for students to enter the school through in the morning.**

Student Parking – Students parking vehicles on school property are required to park in the North-West section of the parking lot that sits to the West of the Tech-Ed Shops. **A student parking pass may be obtained from the main office.**

**Please always drive carefully and slowly while on school property & do not enter or travel through the Bus Lane.**



## STUDENT BIKES, SCOOTERS & BOARDS

**Students and Guardians.** Please make sure you have the necessary equipment to secure your personal transportation devices to one of the provided parking racks surrounding the outside of the school. **Scooters, Skateboards, Bikes and like devices are not permitted to be stored inside the school as this can create a safety hazard.**

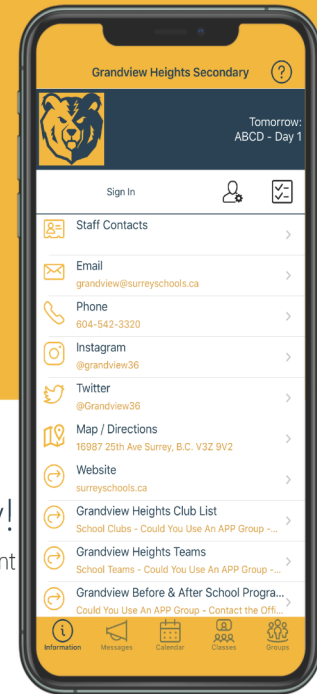
