We gather evidence of student learning, often communicating this using Proficiency Scales, so that students know where they are at in their learning journey and know where they need to go to improve. Student learning will be celebrated in a way that is authentic to how we assess each student's learning journey as a school.

I am so proud of our students and staff and what they have accomplished in two and a half short months. We have over 21 school clubs sponsored by teachers and a full fall sports roster from junior- senior girls and boys volley ball, our aquatics teams and cross-country team. I have had the opportunity to see some amazing volleyball matches. I am very proud of our student athletes and the work that they are doing in representing Grandview Heights. A big thank you to all of our teacher and parent community coaches in supporting our athletics program. # VOLLEYBALL

"It's been a hard-fought and successful season thus far for the grade 8 boys' volleyball team. Tier 1 has proven to be a challenge, but the boys earned a tie for 2nd place in our division. They then went on to secure a spot into the South Fraser championships. Beating out Semiahmoo and Elgin team white.

South Fraser Championships take place November 8th to 10th, with finals being held on our home turf. Making it to the big game will be a challenge, but our boys are up for it.

Congrats go out to the grade 8 boys on stepping up in tier 1 for first ever season at Grandview, and representing the Grizzlies with pride!!"

The grade 8 girls volleyball team has been competing in the Tier 1 league where we have been seeing some amazing athletes and tough competition. The players have been keeping the games close and improving their skills through training and persistence. The team has also competed in a fun costume tournament over the Halloween weekend, and we are now qualified for the South Fraser Volleyball Draw.

JR. Boys - The Boy's JV Volleyball team played exceptionally well in their inaugural season, with several very exciting games. They have finished their regular season placing second in their region. They are entering into the playoffs this week as they play in the city championships.

The Junior Girls' Volleyball team started the season hosting Grandview Height's very first tournament - the Grizzly Growl, with 12 teams from

across the Lower Mainland gracing our magnificent facility. The girls played well, reaching the Quarter Finals, only to be beaten by Seaquam, the eventual champions.



The team carried their form forward into league play, finishing 3rd in their division and eventually qualified for Surrey Championships and the South Fraser Valley Championship being hosted in Richmond next week.

The senior girls' volleyball team had the unique opportunity to be the first ever Grandview team to represent their school and have had a phenomenal season! The Grizzlies finished the top of their division with a perfect 9-0 record. Overall, the girls have had 3 top 3 finishes at tournaments and have a season record of 27-5. The girls are now getting ready for playoffs where they hope to qualify for provincial championships. Excellent job Grizzlies.

Senior Boys finished first in their league with a win over Regent Christian in our own gymnasium. Lights, smoke machine, a painted banner, announcer, and loud music filled the Grizzly Den previewing what was to be an exciting evening of volleyball stretching to 5 sets.

The boys have had an amazing run and now look toward the South Fraser Valley playoffs. An excellent job done by the coaches and the players to pull together such a successful season with a roster comprised of grade 10 and 11 boys – playing in a senior division in such a short period of time.

# **CAREER CENTRE NEWS**

# SURREY SCHOOL DISTRICT PROGRAMS

These programs are excellent opportunities for students to get a head start in their formal trades training. Seats are limited and students must undergo a successful application and interview process to secure a seat. Students usually complete graduation requirements (Grade 11 Math, Socials, English and Science and English 12) at their home school. District programs are in partnership with post-secondary institutions such as Kwantlen Polytechnic University (KPU), British Columbia Institute of Technology (BCIT) or Vancouver Community College (VCC). It is expected that students will graduate at their regular scheduled time and would receive both high school and post-secondary credits while completing a District Program. The tuition is paid for by the Surrey School District—*this could mean a cost savings of thousands of dollars!!* (Students are responsible for purchasing books, steel toed boots, tool, any required post-secondary registration and fees).

# YOUTH WRK STUDENTS

Students may be eligible for Youth WRK courses while they are already working in a trade. These are courses where students receive credit for hours worked on-the-job after school, during summers or on weekends. For every 120 hours of paid work a student performs in a trade area the student can receive one four-credit elective course. They can earn up to a maximum of 4 courses (480 hours), which may enable them to graduate a semester early if desired. If students complete all 480 hours, continue working in their trade area and meet outlined criteria, they may be **eligible for a \$1,000 scholarship** after graduation!

The most common student jobs include:

Dooking at a restaurant (like Moxie's; White Spot; The Keg; Hotels)

Virtually all construction and automotive jobs
