
I wish all of our students, staff, and families a warm, joyful, and restful holiday season. Let's return in January ready to make 2026 another incredible year for the Grizzlies.



ATHLETIC NEWS

Grizzly Athletics – Fall Season Success

Our fall athletics season has been exceptional. Grandview fielded 10 teams during our fall season (6 volleyball teams, 2 boys soccer teams, Aquatics and Cross Country teams). Many teams finished at or near the top of their leagues and had strong showings at South Fraser and even provincial championships.

Senior Boys Soccer

Our Senior boys had an exceptional season finishing near the top of their division. They peaked in playoffs where they won the South Fraser Championship game earning a berth to provincial championships where they finished 8th in BC!

Junior Boys Soccer

Our Junior boys team finished top 8 in Surrey which qualified them for South Frasers where they tied for 5th.

Grade 8 Girls Volleyball Teams

We were lucky enough to find coaches to support 26 girls and 2 teams at the Grade 8 level! Our Gold team finished 2nd in Surrey making it all the way to the Surrey Championship game. They had a solid showing at South Frasers falling one win short away from provincials.

Junior Girls Volleyball Team

Our junior girls had an exceptional season. They dominated league play, finished near the top in all their tournaments and finished 2nd in Surrey, 2nd in South Frasers, and 5th place at Provincials!

Senior Girls Team

Our girls senior girls finished 5th in South Frasers and were one win away from Provincial championships. Their major highlight was taking home the title and winning a 28 team tournament at Victoria Island University.

Junior Boys Volleyball Team

With the addition of a last second coach, the boys had the opportunity to play in their league. This was a great experience for the boys as they came in with little volleyball experience so had the chance to improve and win several games.

Senior Boys Volleyball Team

The boys finished top 4 in their division and finished 5th in South Frasers and were 2 wins away from BC championships. The highlight of their season was hosting a 3 day, 20 team tournament at Grandview and taking home Bronze.

Cross-Country

Our athletes represented Grandview with determination at regional competitions, with several strong individual finishes. We earned top spot in the Junior Category winning South Frasers. Several athletes had the chance to travel to Nanaimo to compete in provincials

Aquatics

Our swim team dominated the pool taking home several South Fraser Banners. They succeeded in both team relays and individual races. Many students competed at Provincial championships.

WINTER SPORTS

Our winter sports season is just getting started. We are fielding 7 basketball teams, an ice hockey team and are sending a handful of wrestlers to compete in local events. Grandview is excited to support these teams and cheer them on.



PARKING / DROP-OFFS & PICK-UP INSTRUCTIONS


Grandview Heights Secondary Administration, staff and school PAC has worked together with the Surrey School District and City of Surrey to address some of the many traffic and safety concerns in and around our school property. I would like to thank our PACs transportation committee for their leadership and help with our work together. We have included a school traffic flow map and general updates to ensure student and staff safety remains a top priority during the morning drop off and afternoon pick up times. Please review the following information and be sure to adhere to all instructions included in this communication.

The major concerns are regarding the South-West Entrance way that runs along the West side of the Main office and in front of the Theatre. In particular, the congestion that is created when the Visitor Parking and the Accessible Parking spaces are used for the drop-off and pick-up of students is an issue that we would like to bring to everyone's attention. We ask that vehicles do not pull into, and then out of, the Staff & Student Parking Lot or any Accessible Parking spaces for the purpose of drop-offs or pick-ups.


Student Drop-Off and Pick-Up. For parents dropping off students at school, there are two laneways which run along the South side of the main classroom section of Grandview Heights. Vehicles will need to travel towards the far South-East part of the school property to enter these lanes and turn left to enter these lanes and head West through the laneways. The laneway furthest to the South has angled visitor parking spaces, while the laneway North of this is designed for vehicles to pull parallel to the curb to allow for exit and entrance to vehicles by students. **Please be aware that the doors on the East side of the building are available for students to enter the school through in the morning.**

Student Parking – Students parking vehicles on school property are required to park in the North-West section of the parking lot that sits to the West of the Tech-Ed Shops. A student parking pass may be obtained from the main office.

Please always drive carefully and slowly while on school property & do not enter or travel through the Bus Lane.

Once a student is withdrawn or graduates, Example: is no longer an <u>Active</u> student in the District, their account is placed in a holding state for 40 calendar days. During this time, the former student may access emails and files they previously had access to in Office 365. After the 40 calendar days have elapsed, the surreyschools.ca account expires which means emails and files are no longer accessible.
